There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest." What do I do with it?" Jesus makes a distinction between "need" & "Greed:" the difference between "means" & "meaning."













"Need V Greed," "Means V Meaning" There was an insightful Charles Schultz cartoon in a local newspaper some years ago. In it, you see Snoopy sitting outside his kennel looking very 'down.' His ears are down, his eyes are sad and his face is glum. In another cartoon frame, you see Snoopy spring to his feet; his ears perk up, his eyes gleam with joy and his face radiates satisfaction. The reason; Charlie Brown approaches with a bowl of dog food and Snoopy lets out a scream, "Ah meaning!"

You have an example of what Schultz refers to in the parable in today's Gospel, in which a farmer, like Snoopy, mistakes means for meaning. The

Gospel begins with someone in the crowd approaching Jesus with a rather peculiar request: "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." You have one more example of the adage, "Where there's a will, there's a relative." Jesus refuses to get involved in a family dispute. Instead, he focuses on the cause of the dispute – greed over need. Jesus uses a parable to illustrate his answer. It is a story about a rich man who became rich because he worked very hard and reaped a bountiful harvest. He wondered what he would do with his excess wealth. Luke gives his answer

"I will tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, 'Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink and be merry."

His answer reminds us of a similar answer given by **John D. Rockefeller** when he was asked, "How much money is enough?" His response, was "Just a little bit more."


Some years ago, "greed not need," caused a downturn in the economy on Wall Street & Main Street, &. a downward spiral in the U.S. economy & economies in many parts of the Western World, which, in turn, impacted people's lives, leading to loss of jobs and foreclosures on homes.

What does Jesus say in today's Gospel? "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; & the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?" Then, Jesus concludes, "Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

Today's Gospel does not take the rich man to task because of his possessions which he earned because of hard work and ingenuity; what Jesus takes to task in today's Gospel is his attitude of greed over need. We oftentimes make the same mistake as Snoopy in today's cartoon – we fail to distinguish between means and meaning. Money affords means to provide for the necessities of life. It cannot give your life meaning. The simple teaching in Charles Schultz cartoon and in Jesus' parable in today's Gospel is: a standard of life is far more important than a standard of living. The parable poses the question: What is important to you? Where do your values lie?

#### Friday, August 1st, First Friday


Friday, August 1st, is the First Friday of the month. The 8 a.m. Mass will be followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, which will conclude with Benediction at 9 a.m.



The Practice of the "Holy Hour" on First Fridays goes back to the aftermath of the Last Supper. Jesus took Peter, James and John – his 'inner circle' – to the Garden of Gethsemane, immediately after the Last Supper – the celebration of the Eucharist. He brought them for support. After a period of great suffering and sadness in the midst of his prayer, Jesus came to his three disciples looking for support and solace; he found them asleep. He chides them with the words, "Could you not watch one hour with me?"

This incident after the Last Supper – the First Mass – gave rise to the practice of a "Holy Hour" in the context of the Mass on First Fridays. We invite and encourage you to spend time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday morning.

## Collection for Church Service Center Weekend of August 2<sup>nd</sup>/3rd



### Parents: Give your children a Moral Compass

Every day, our kids face any number of moral dilemmas. Should I tell the truth? Should I copy from my friend's homework, or let him copy from mine? Should I watch this racy DVD? Should I treat a classmate with kindness?

Young children probably won't use the words moral dilemma to describe these scenarios, but they do

understand that some decisions are harder than others, and that some choices are better than others. As kids get older, they understand the pressure to conform to an immoral culture—a culture with challenges not faced by previous generations.

As parents, we want to raise our children to make moral choices that will lead them toward honorable, successful lives. Can we help them build a moral compass that gives them a sense of direction when faced with life's difficult decisions?

Fighter pilots sometimes experience a phenomenon known as vertigo. When this happens, a pilot can become disoriented as to how fast and high he is going. If he relies on his sensations or memory, he may lose control of the aircraft. But one thing will not lie to the pilot—his instruments. His instruments help him determine his orientation and speed so he can safely control the plane.

I like using this example with young people because it illustrates two key components of truth and morality: First, when we're confused about what to do, a standard does exist, something that helps us recognize up from down, right from wrong. Second, that moral standard is necessarily outside our own feelings and intuition. The very concept of morality means that the standard of truth comes from a higher authority—beyond just the rules or habits of our culture.


Put another way, trying to live a moral life on our own is . . . well, impossible. But God never intended anyone to be on his or her own. When we trust in Him, He provides the guidance and support to walk in accordance with His plan. In moments of confusion, God provides us with an "instrument panel."

Children, like their adult parents, are living in a very confusing time. Moral relativism in our culture is pervasive. Children live with a maze of confusion. Simon and Garfunkel in their song "The Sounds of silence" give expression to this confusion in the line from that song, "Hello darkness my old friend." Jesus describes himself as the "moral compass" in references like, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life," and "I am the Light." Enroll your children in the school of Religion. If you love your children, give them a moral compass. Call Myara, 453-7537.


