

"Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted."



Who am I? True self, False self.

Being invited to a meal can be very revealing as we can see Jesus illustrate in today's Gospel (Luke 14:7-14).

Jesus was invited to a meal by a leading Pharisee. The Gospel tells us that the people at the meal "were observing him [Jesus] carefully." If his guests were "watching him carefully" Jesus was, also, aware of their disposition, watching them, jockeying for positions


of importance in the seating arrangements at the table.

Jesus exposes the underlying attitudes inherent in this jockeying for positions of importance at the banquet table. He uses a story or parable of a wedding banquet as a kind of 'sugar-coated-pill" to expose the attitudes of the guests. The implication in the story is, that it is the place at table that gives honor to the guest. Jesus makes the opposite point in the story of the wedding feast: it is the **person** who gives honor at the table and **not the place** where he/she is seated.

The point that Jesus is making in the parable is that the dignity of the human person is not extrinsic but intrinsic to the person. You are not important because of where you live; what you do for a living; what you achieve in life as an athlete or actor or as a writer or as a straight "A" student or what kind of car you drive. Those are factors that are extrinsic to you. Your dignity, your importance, is something that is intrinsic to you, namely, that you are made, in the words of the first book of the Bible (Genesis 1), by God "in his image and likeness."

We are reminded of this every time we come to Mass to celebrate the banquet of the Eucharist. As we enter the Church, we dip our finger in the holy water font and make the sign of the Cross. This simple practice recalls our **Baptism**, in which we became sons and daughters of a loving Father. That is who we are – sons and daughters of a loving Father. That is why Jesus reminds his host in today's Gospel, "When you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. Blessed will you be because of their inability to repay you." We forget that, we allow others in other social settings to give us a sense of who we are. You pick up an illustration of this in a popular book regarded as the bible of every good salesman, **Dale Carnegie's** "How to win friends and influence people." The fallacy that Jesus is exposing in today's Gospel is contained in the title of that book. The opening phrase gives it to us, "How to win friends." To "win" a friend and "influence" people, you have to do something. It's 'a quid pro quo' exchange; "I give so that you do" — the pharmaceutical sales Rep who indulges doctors with dining, free trips, free passes to games and shows so the doctors peddle their drugs with their patients. The Doctor is manipulated and made to feel important so the salesman can "use him" to peddle drugs to his patients.

Jesus would re-title Dale Carnegie's the book, not, "How to win friends and influence people," but, "How to be a friend" – that is, recognize the inherent dignity in every person, because they are made "in the image and likeness of God." What Jesus is saying in today's Gospel is that Christians are not called to "win friends"; they are called to "be friends." Let's give St. Francis the last word: "What I am before God is what I am, and nothing more."




