



Baptism of Jesus
Piero della Francesco (1448-50)

Piero della Francesco paints Jesus with an ugly face. Why? In doing so, he chose to follow a biblical quote, ***“He had no beauty that we should desire him” (Is 53:2)*** The ‘ugly face’ represents the flawed human nature he assumed to show his solidarity with the sinful human condition into which he was born. Jesus receives baptism in the midst of Luke’s assorted, sinful people (3:12/13). This was **Jesus’ mission**: to identify with our sinful condition; to transform it **from sinner to “God’s Beloved.”** This is represented in the painting with the young person, dressing after Baptism, with the same color white skin as Jesus.

tradition. The ‘ugly face’ represents the flawed human nature he assumed to show his solidarity with the sinful human condition into which he was born. Jesus insists on receiving baptism in the midst of this assorted, sinful people. It is God’s will that he do so in this manner.


What moves Jesus to take this step? Why does he leave Nazareth, his family, his occupation? His first step is to go to John in the midst of the penitents. His first official act is something like his “**life agenda**”. Right from the beginning Jesus takes up the place that expresses the mission of his life: in the midst of us poor sinners, as if he was one of us. Even his name expresses his mission: Jesus in Hebrew means “**God saves**”. The angel had explained to Joseph in a dream that this was the reason for calling the child that Mary was expecting Jesus: “**For he will save his people from their sins.**” We see a man dressing after his baptism in Della Francesca’s painting. His skin is the same color as Jesus: he now shares his life.

So, this connects Jesus’ birth with his baptism, which begins his mission: he came to free us from our sins. That is why he, the Son of God, became man: that is why he comes to the River Jordan, in order to place himself in the midst of us sinners and to take our burden of guilt and sin upon himself. And God shows his approval: “**This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased**” This is the simple message of Christmas: “**For God so loved the world that He sent his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him**” (John 3: 16-17).

The Baptism of Jesus begins His Mission & Ministry

Why does the Christmas season end for the Church with the Baptism of Jesus, which he did not request from John until he was 30 years old? What did this have to do with the birth of Jesus?

Today most children of Christian parents are already baptized soon after birth. It was different at the time when John the Baptist made his call to repentance. Many heard his call & went down with him to the River Jordan in order to confess their sins. Luke the Evangelist gives a vivid account of all who came there to receive the baptism of repentance: **soldiers, prostitutes, tax collectors, and people of ill repute and of all occupational strata.** If you look closely at the cover picture by **Piero Della Francesca**, you will see the Pharisees & Sadducees in the background, dressed, coming for John’s baptism of repentance. Then suddenly Jesus shows up in their midst. John shrinks back. **What was he doing in such company?** If you look closely at the face of Jesus it is painted as an ugly face. Why? Piero Della Francesca chose a biblical quote “**He had no beauty that we should desire him**” (Is 53:2) and, rendered Christ with an unprecedented ugliness in the 14th century Italian



Bautismo del Señor

Los versículos que dicen que no romperá la caña resquebrajada ni apagará la mecha que aún humea (Isaías 42,3) describen la misericordia de Jesús hacia los pecadores. La caña y la mecha fueron desechadas porque eran inútiles. Pero Dios, por amor a nosotros, nunca ve a los pecadores como inútiles. Dios siempre está dispuesto a perdonarnos y darnos otra oportunidad, por eso envió a Jesús para perdonar a los pecadores, no para rechazarlos. Juan al principio se niega a bautizar a Jesús, porque su bautismo era una señal de arrepentimiento por el pecado. Sabía que Jesús no era pecador, así que no tenía necesidad de arrepentirse. Pero Jesús se identificó con los pecadores y los acogió de nuevo en el amor de Dios. Podemos pedirle a Dios que nos ayude a ver nuestra pecaminosidad y presentársela a Él. Una **alianza** era un acuerdo entre socios desiguales, en el que el más fuerte se comprometía a proteger o defender al más débil, mientras que este se comprometía a pagar impuestos u obedecer las leyes exigidas por el más fuerte. Dios ofrece una nueva alianza a través de Jesús. Hoy aún tenemos que vivir esa alianza, amando a Dios y al prójimo. Al vivir la nueva alianza, descubriremos que Dios también tiene sus complacencias en nosotros. —Tom Schmidt
