# Feast of Christ the King

Then he [Dismas] said, "Remember me when you come into your kingdom." He [Jesus | replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise."



### Who do the "2 thieves" on the Cross, Represent?

From the cross, Jesus interceded for sinners. Today, risen and glorified, Jesus remains the "one mediator between God and mankind" (1 Timothy 2:5). Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive them," because He was putting into practice the principle He had taught in the Sermon on the Mount: "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Mt 5:43–44). Jesus prayed for all those at the foot of the Cross who were persecuting him – "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do."

### Who was the - Repentant thief - "The Good Thief"?

The exchange, "Remember me when you come into your kingdom... today you will be with me in paradise," is a famous exchange from the Luke's Gospel about a repentant criminal—"the Good Thief" - traditionally named Dismas. He was crucified beside Jesus and received a promise of salvation in his final moments—"Today, you will be with me in Paradise."



#### The story from Luke 23:39-43:

- The setting: Jesus is being crucified between 2 criminals on Mount Calvary.
- The first criminal: sometimes referred to as Gestas taunts Jesus, saying, "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!". He doesn't ask for forgiveness.
- The second, the repentant criminal: known as Dismas, rebukes the other criminal. He acknowledges that they are being punished justly for their crimes, while Jesus has done nothing wrong. He then turns to Jesus and pleads:
  - "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom".


    Jesus's response: "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise".
- We hear those words re-echoed by the priest every time we go to the Sacrament of Penance: "May Our Lord Jesus Christ Absolve you and, by his authority, I absolve you from your sins..." The 2 thieves on the Cross represent you and me: Do I ask for forgiveness like the 'Good Thief,' by going to Confession, or, do I fail to ask for forgiveness like the 'other criminal', rarely, or, never going to Confession?





#### Advent Communal Penance Service

The season of Advent, a new Liturgical year, begins next Sunday, Nov 30. There will be an OLG Parish Advent Communal Penance Service, in Church, on Tuesday, Dec 16, 2025, at 6:30 P.M. It is an opportune time to "begin anew" with the New Liturgical Year to, like the "Good Thief," avail of Jesus' forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance. Let's prepare our hearts to welcome Jesus at Christmas.



Thanksgiving Began in Florida and not in New England

Robyn Gioia, a teacher in Jacksonville attended a teachers' workshop some years ago and heard **Michael Gannon**, a retired history scholar from the University of Florida, tell the story of Pedro Menendez de Aviles. Gannon, first laid out the premise of an earlier Thanksgiving in his scholarly book *The Cross in the Sand* in **1965**, but few picked up on it. He says his mention of Menendez's meal was a "throwaway line that lay fallow for 20 years."

An **Associated Press reporter in 1985** exposed Gannon's academic findings to the world, which caused what Gannon remembers as "a storm of interest. I was on the phone for three days straight." Traditionalists, especially in New England, dubbed him "The Grinch who stole Thanksgiving."

Gannon took it with good humor. "I became rather famous at the time for saying that by the time the Pilgrims came to Plymouth, St. Augustine was up for urban renewal." Gannon thinks the word is finally, but slowly, getting out, but he's well aware that the victors write the history books. And history, once written, is hard to change. "The English wrote the history and established the traditions," he says. "That's life. Get over it."

Whether the 1st Thanksgiving Mass was celebrated by Father Lopez at St. Augustine in 1565, or, the 1st Thanksgiving Service was celebrated by the Pilgrims at Plymouth Rock in 1621, it is important that the most blessed nation in the world should take time out to thank God, despite the fairly recent worst pandemic in over 100 years, which changed our way of life, as did recent hurricanes, *Helene* and *Mostel*; there is unrest in our country and, the economy is struggling to come back; we have very painful wars in Ukraine & Gaza Strip. And, yet, we have so much for which to be grateful. And, it is important that we take time to do so.

¿Alguna vez has sido acusado falsamente y has sentido que no hiciste nada para merecer la culpa? ¿Cuál es tu reacción ante acusaciones falsas? ¿Ira? ¿Negación? ¿Frustración? ¿Desesperanza? ¿Aceptación? Jesús y el criminal redimido ofrecen un gran ejemplo de cómo manejar la adversidad cuando una situación te golpea duramente.

Jesús se acercaba al final de su tiempo en la tierra, pero se centró en *salvar un alma más* antes de reunirse con el Padre. Este acto desinteresado nos muestra que, independientemente de las circunstancias de la vida, siempre habrá alguien ahí para ayudarnos. Ese Alguien es Jesucristo. El criminal redimido sabía que estaría con Jesús en el cielo gracias a sus palabras. Pasó un tiempo en *silencio sagrado*, dejando que el amor y la misericordia de Dios lo llenara.

¿Cuándo experimentamos el silencio sagrado? Vemos varios ejemplos en la Misa. Durante el Acto Penitencial, reconocemos en silencio nuestros pecados. Inmediatamente después, el sacerdote dice: "Oremos", y ese momento de silencio nos sirve de puerta para hablar con el Señor y para que Él nos llene de su amor y misericordia. Después de la homilía, también hacemos un momento de silencio. Es un momento para pedirle al Señor que llene nuestro corazón y alma con el amor y la misericordia de Dios. 🗗

Otro ejemplo es sentarme con Jesús en Adoración. Una hora en silencio llena de amor, comprensión y conexión personal con Él. El silencio sagrado está ahí cuando me doy cuenta de que Jesús siempre está presente, pase lo que pase. Él quiere decirme que todo estará bien y que confíe en Él y en su voluntad. Es cuando nuestros corazones se unen al suyo en un momento de puro amor y una paz que nos llena.


