Big Ideas from the Sermon

- Scripture teaches that there is one true and living God
 - God eternally exists as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
 - God alone is worthy of worship, allegiance, and trust
 - God has no beginning and no end...He is the great “I AM”
 - God is ultimately about His glory...and that is good news for us
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Discussion Questions

Understanding the Belief

1. Read **Deuteronomy 6:4** together. Why do you think Scripture is so intentional about emphasizing that God is one?

2. Jesus says in **John 8:58**, “Before Abraham was born, I AM.” What would this statement have meant to the people hearing it at the time?

Why This Is Significant

3. Read **Isaiah 44:6**. How does believing God has no beginning or end shape the way we trust Him?
4. Scripture consistently rejects the idea of “other gods” (**Psalms 115:4–8**). Where do you see modern versions of false gods showing up in everyday life?

Life Application

5. Romans 9 challenges the idea that life is primarily about us. What changes when we see God’s purposes as bigger than our own comfort or plans?
6. Read **James 4:8–10**. What might humility, honor, or surrender look like in a practical way this week?

Prayer Prompt

Thank God for revealing Himself clearly. Ask for humility to trust Him fully...and surrender to the one true God who draws near to us.

We Believe: One True God

Quick Recap

Scripture teaches there is one true and living God...eternal, self-existent, and unmatched. He has revealed Himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He alone is worthy of worship and trust.

Read together: **Isaiah 44:6**

Discussion Questions

1. What does this passage tell us about who God is...and who He is not?
2. Where are you most tempted to rely on something created rather than the Creator?
