Quick Recap

This week's message asked one of the most important questions we can bring to Scripture: What does God say about the unborn? Through the Christmas story in Luke 1, the Psalms, Jeremiah, and Genesis, we find a God who is intimately involved in every human life before birth — assigning value, dignity, and even spiritual identity to the unborn. And for anyone whose past intersects painfully with this topic, the same God extends grace that is immediate and final.

Read Together

Read aloud as a group:

Psalm 139:13-16

For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made...

Jeremiah 1:4-5

Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations

Discuss

1. What does it do to you — emotionally or spiritually — to read that **God knew you and set you apart before you were born**? How does that shape the way you think about unborn life in general?
2. The message said God's heart on hard topics isn't about finding the line — it's about **loving what he loves**. What would it look like for your group to respond to this issue with that posture?

Closing Prayer

Ask God for his heart toward the vulnerable and the unborn. Pray for anyone in your group who carries personal pain connected to this topic — that they would experience the grace and freedom Jesus offers.
