"Last days" refers to a period of time at the end of the age, but "last day" refers to something else. The term "the last day" is used 6 times in the Bible, and all of them are in John 6.

These verses spoken by Jesus refer to the resurrection of the righteous:

John 6:39--"This is the will of Him who sent Me, that of all that He has given Me I lost nothing, but raise it up on **the last day**."

John 6:40--"For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on **the last day**."

John 6:44--"No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him, and I will raise him up on the last day."

John 6:54--"He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will rise him up on **the last day**."

This verse is spoken by Martha, who was referring to the future resurrection of the righteous: John 11:24 -- "Martha said to Him, 'I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

This verse spoken by Jesus refers to the Judgment and resurrection of lost people:

"He who rejects Me and does not receive My says, has one who judges him; the word I spoke is what will judge him at **the last day**" (John 12:48).

We know that the resurrection of the righteous and the resurrection of the lost <u>do not</u> happen at the same time. First Corinthians 15:23 refers to an "order" of resurrection. The order looks like this:

- 1. The Rapture of the Church (1 Thess. 4:16-17)
- 2. The resurrection of the two witnesses (Rev. 11:8-12).
- 3. The resurrection of the Old Testament saints & Tribulations saints (Dan. 12:2, Rev. 20:4)
- 4. The resurrection and judgment of all lost people at the Great White Throne (Rev. 20:11-15)

CONCLUSION: "The last day" refers to EVERY PERSON (both saved and lost) when their natural bodies ("dust") are converted into their resurrected bodies for all eternity. **It is the <u>last day of their earthly</u> existence and beginning of their eternal state.** All followers of Jesus will have glorified bodies (1 Cor. 15:35-49), while all lost people will have hideous, corrupt bodies (Isa. 66:24).
