HFM PARTNERS WITH AMAZING CHURCHES

Over the years, Habitat for Missionaries has been privileged to partner with some amazing congregations. **Battle Creek First Wes** (Battle Creek, MI) was the church that first encouraged us to follow through on our dream of renovating homes to fund missionaries and the first to send a short term missions team to help us with a building project.

Park Place Wesleyan (Pinellas Park, FL) has already renovated two homes in the past three years, raising a little over \$40K for missions. Last year, their missionary giving was more than doubled by the proceeds of their HFM project. Now they are ready to launch a third renovation, this time to raise support for "home missions", a church plant in Tampa, FL.

Faith Wesleyan (Lakeland, FL) is a wonderful mission minded church, but one with an aged congregation. Most of them are no longer available for climbing ladders or pounding nails. Nevertheless, they have helped renovate three homes by providing over \$100,000 in interest free loans to fund HFM projects. The financial return for that investment in God's Kingdom? A little over \$60,000 in missionary support!

Over the past 50 years, **Holland Central Wesleyan** (Holland, MI) has sent out numerous members of their congregation as missionaries and given millions of dollars in support. They have been a leader in our denomination and a role model for mission minded churches everywhere. This year, in addition to their generous financial gifts, they are lending time and talent to a local HFM project to raise funds for another one of their home grown missionary candidates. In this case, the renovated home will then provide affordable housing for a member of their congregation.



Chapel Pike Wesleyan (Marion, IN) partnered with us on two projects in '06 and '07, raising \$23,000 for one of their missionaries. In 2009, they helped develop the HFM RV park for interstate volunteers. Chapel Pike has always been a mission minded church, giving thousands of dollars annually to support more than a dozen missionaries. However, after they released their Youth Pastor and 40 adults to rejuvenate a nearby Wesleyan church, they were unable to meet their annual mission's budget. Rather than reduce the number of missionaries they supported, Chapel Pike determined to make up the short fall by partnering with HFM on additional building projects. In a little over a month, they've raised \$2500 by renovating a kitchen and hope to take on addition work to meet all of their missionary commitments.

I could go on and on, singing the praises of churches that are truly global in their vision. They minister affectively locally, they give annually to missions, but then go the second mile to support international ministry by partnering with HFM. To me, they are truly amazing churches.
