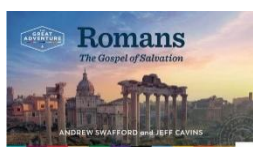

Discover What It Means to “Be Saved”

Romans: The Gospel of Salvation is an 8-session study that explores St. Paul's teaching on salvation and the new life we receive in Jesus Christ.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans has been central to Christian reflection and conversion. This study examines one of the most important books of the New Testament, showing how Romans reveals the meaning of salvation. More than the removal of guilt, salvation means entering into Christ's life, death, and Resurrection and sharing

in his divine life. **As you journey through this study, you will also learn the true meaning of key passages about faith, works of the law, and justification.**

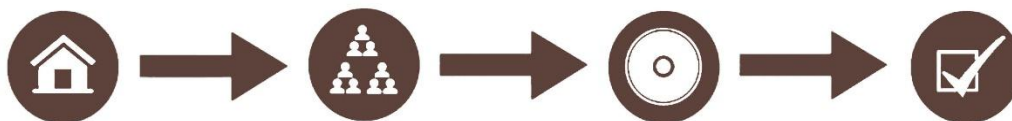
