

PASTOR'S COLUMN

"But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first...So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:31, 42-45, NRSV)

If the previous' Sunday's message was difficult for you, please know that it was difficult for me to prepare and preach. We all have possessions that we would part with tomorrow. We also have those we would grieve if we lost them. Peter reminded Jesus that he and the other disciples left *all* behind to follow Him. Some had families. Others had businesses. All left their dreams, their plans, and their ambitions, to follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

And, Jesus commended them. Yet, he provided a sober reminder – the first shall be last, and the last will be first! Yes, the disciples were the leaders of the pack in the Kingdom of God. No one made the sacrifices that they did, prior to and following the death and resurrection of Jesus. So, James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were with Jesus and Peter when Jesus was transfigured before them, approached Jesus. They asked whether or not they could rule next to Jesus. Those who were seated closest to the King had the most power. Perhaps, they were merely ambitious. Perhaps they were tired of being in Peter's shadow, and so they needed to beat Peter to the punch. Perhaps they continued to dream of God's Kingdom in worldly terms, reflecting the great Kingdoms of the world. Whatever their motivation, they missed the mark entirely. Yes, they left all to follow Jesus. Yes, they are the, at this point, greatest in the Kingdom of God.

However, remember Jesus' destination. It's a cross. Remember Jesus' glory. It's his death. Remember those who are next to him when he dies. Yes, they are thieves. The greatest among us are servants.

They are the people who are here Sunday after Sunday, teaching our children. They keep the building clean. They work quietly in their place, with contentment and joy. They need no prestige. They work without pretense. They are secure in who they are. The know whose they are. And, thus, they are the greatest in the Kingdom of God.

Jesus says to James and John that if they want to be the greatest, they must have a heart to serve, to give, to sacrifice and to do so with the goal of loving people into the Kingdom of God. That's true greatness. Those are the ones who will sit at Jesus' right and left in the Kingdom of God.
