#### **PASTOR'S COLUMN**

"I have heard your prayer, and have chosen this place for myself as a house of sacrifice. When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command the locust to devour the land, or send pestilence among my people, if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, pray, seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land. Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayer that is made in this place. For now I have chosen and consecrated this house so that my name may be there forever; my eyes and my heart will be there for all time." (2 Chronicles 7:12-16. NRSV)

Many of you are familiar with the Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir. Maybe you are not familiar with the story of the church. Jim Cymbala felt called to serve what he found to be a dying church in the Middle of Brooklyn. Through outreach efforts to the community and efforts of revival within the congregation (not a week-long service like we are used to, but intentional efforts on the part of the congregation's leadership) the Brooklyn Tabernacle became a thriving, multi-generational, multi-ethnic congregation that featured people from all walks of life across socio-economic boundaries.

Cymbala did not begin with that vision in mind. He simply began with a vision about prayer. He returned from a vacation in Florida and addressed his congregation:

I really feel that I have heard from God about the future of our church. While I was away, I was calling out to God to help us...understand what he wants most from us. [The answer] is not fancy or profound or spectacular. But I want to say to you today with all the seriousness I can muster: From this day on, the prayer meeting will be the barometer of our church. What happens on Tuesday night will be the gauge by which we will judge success or failure because that will be the measure by which God blesses us. (Fresh Wind, Fresh Fire, p. 27)

Cymbala went on to remind his church that God promises nothing for those who do not call upon him. For those who do, with audacity, persistence and faith, he promises to give his Spirit in return (Luke 11:13). "This is the engine that will drive our church," Cymbala said. In the course of the service, a visiting minister stood up and proclaimed, "You can tell how popular a church is by who comes on Sunday Morning. You can tell how popular the pastor is by who comes on Sunday Night. But you can tell how popular Jesus is by who comes to the prayer meeting."

Beginning Wednesday Night, September 13 at 6:30 PM, our Wednesday Night will have a different flavor. It will be a Service of Prayer, with a more formal, yet intimate flavor than our current Wednesday Night programming for adults (children and youth programs will remain the same). It will be a service of worship. It will be a time when we gather to share our concerns, as we have done. But it will also be a time when things that are not God's concerns will become our concerns.

In next week's column, I will share more, but I want you to know that this is part of the fruits of my Doctor of Ministry program. During the course of the program, I have been making individual and corporate prayer under the guidance of the Lord's Prayer the focus of my research. I am looking forward to sharing those fruits with you.
