#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

**Sunday will be a morning of celebration as we ordain two new deacons - Penny Parker and Belinda Camper!** As part of our time of worship, you will be invited to offer a word of blessing and prayer over each deacon either by coming forward during our "laying on of hands" or by writing your blessing. Later in the service, both Belinda and Penny will be serving communion for the first time as deacons. I am grateful that the Church continues to follow the New Testament example of deacon servant leadership, and grateful that Christfollowers like Belinda and Penny say "yes" to serving our church in this capacity. If you're in town, I hope you'll join us for worship.

I want to tell you about an opportunity that has come our way. Some months back, I received an invitation from Paul Baxley, the Executive Coordinator of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) to participate in a new, grant-funded initiative. As you may already know, seminary enrollment has declined rapidly and often, those who do graduate from seminary live their ministry calling outside the local church. The unfortunate reality is that few of our young people are responding to a call to church ministry, and that is especially the case when it comes to the senior pastor role.

After seeing and hearing this growing need for senior pastors, CBF has begun to look at how to be proactive in nurturing the potential call of young people to church ministry. In doing so, they have invited a handful of senior pastors - and by extension, their congregation - to join them in imagining what this might look like. There are some components already set into motion, like a summer mentoring program, while other pieces are still a point of conversation and discernment.

Paul and his team sought out CBF partner churches that were healthy and thriving to join them in this work - and we were asked! I am both honored and proud. After some conversation with our Deacons, I accepted the invitation.

Over the next two years, I will participate in four in-person gatherings alongside the pastors of the other congregations also invited to this endeavor. During those meetings, we will design experiences to shape new pathways for people to explore callings to pastoral ministry and prepare for that calling. The first of those conversations is next week in Decatur, GA.

In addition, in the near future I may be mentoring a younger minister as CBF leadership "believes your congregation could be a beautiful community in which new ministers could be noticed and nurtured."

I still believe in the importance of the local church, and I still believe God is calling men and women to work within the church in all pastoral roles. This is important work, and I look forward to partnering with other congregations in navigating this new reality of call and equipping of pastoral leadership. You'll be hearing more about this process in the months to come.

Don't forget that tonight we'll gather to hear from Don Ledbetter about The Theology of Death. What does scripture actually say about death, dying, and the afterlife? You won't want to miss this conversation! We'll begin at 6:15 p.m. in Fellowship Hall.
