GETTING ALONG

We all read reports of cool and big things happening in churches. Some pastors become prominent. Some Christian leaders discover a remarkable open door for the gospel. Some Christian writers go mega and get inundated with speaking engagements. Some Christian musicians generate music for worship and enjoyment that we want to hear again and again.

I think about the explosive growth of the first-century churches in Asia Minor (modern day Türkiye (name changed on 5.26.22)), and I wish I could be in the middle of something like that. But then I think that the rapid growth phase of those churches cannot have gone on forever. At some point, the regions around those church must have become saturated with the gospel. Christian leaders in those places would have been forced to switch modes from: *Everything we do works!* to *Everything we do stays pretty steady!*

I am most familiar with the second of those modes. And, especially in my first few decades of ministry (now over 44 years), I found myself with a pretty big dose of discontent in my heart. Maybe not totally pure, but mostly I just wanted to see great things happening in my churches and communities.

Three feelings kept pestering me: There must be some ministry I should be having other than the one I have now. There must be some Christians I can serve with other than the ones I have now. And there must be some community for me to evangelize other than the one I have now.

Three wise words from the uber-successful Apostle Paul speak to these thoughts. First, he writes: "Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am" (Philippians 4:11 NAU). Not everything always went great for Paul! And his God-determined circumstances led him to discover that he could learn contentment in Christ. He does not say it was automatic, and he no doubt had to fight for it again and again.

Second, if we feel that we just cannot go on in our current place of ministry, Paul proclaims that we indeed can do just that: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Phil. 4:13). There is a mystery to how these kinds of things work. For example, repentance is chosen by us, but also is granted to us by God. So strength to stay steady in whatever ministry God has given us is given to us by Christ. But we also choose to do like David who "strengthened himself in the Lord."

And third, God is raising up compadres, co-laborers, brothers and sisters, colleagues, confidants, team members, and all manner of the beloved to walk the long road of faithfulness with us. Even as Paul affirmed his contentment and sufficiency in Christ, he affirmed that he did not stay in the fight alone: "Nevertheless, you have done well to share with me in my affliction" (Phil. 4:14). There is a golden nugget of wisdom in that verse. Perhaps the best way to get our focus off the genuine struggle of our own discontent is to find someone who needs us and go help them in Jesus' name. When we do that, everything changes.

It's not wrong to yearn for the kingdom to advance, to seek the greater spiritual gifts, and to earnestly desire to be a useful servant to our Lord.



With the Lord's help and the fellowship of his servants, we can not only "get along" in our ministries, we can thrive.

I was talking with my brother about someone who prayed to receive Christ as Savior and he asked me if I believed that was all that it took to go to heaven. I said yes but he was unconvinced. He had seen far too many who turned away from the faith. Surely a simple prayer was not enough.

Skeptics will point out that "the sinner's prayer" is not in the Bible. Yes, we see all the parts of "the sinner's prayer" in the Bible. We need to admit that we are sinners (Romans 3:23). We need to ask forgiveness (I John 1:9). We need to believe that Jesus died on the cross to forgive us our sins (John 3:16). We need to choose to live for Jesus with Him ruling our lives (John 1:12, Romans 10:9). I'm sure that you can mention plenty more handy verses that can be used.

There are plenty of helpful evangelism tools. There is Evangelism Explosion. There is the Romans Road. There are the 4 Spiritual Laws. There is the Master's Plan of Evangelism. Most of these evangelism methods end in leading the person in some form of "the sinner's prayer". We may even quote a few verses to encourage assurance of Salvation (I John 5:13). But is that all there is?

I compared "the sinner's prayer" to a wedding ceremony. When you say "I do" you are legally married even when you don't feel like it. But my brother argued that the couple can always get a divorce.

I have talked to others who have seen enough people walk away from the faith that they have grown cynical about "the sinner's prayer". Maybe you feel the same way. Maybe you have been hesitant to pray with someone because they may walk away from the faith later.

Here's what bothers me. Salvation is more than assurance of heaven. David sang of being set on a rock and having a new song in his mouth (Psalm 40:2-3). Salvation is a close, personal relationship with almighty God. Does that mean that we're perfect? Of course not. But we should be growing more like Jesus the more that we walk with Him.

Do you think that the Prodigal son ever wandered away again? If he did, do you think that the father would have run to greet him again? Jesus told us to forgive 77 times (or 70 x 7 times depending on your Bible version). It would be hypocritical if God wasn't willing to do the same for us. Never underestimate the power of prayer and God's faithfulness. Both are far greater than our waywardness.

So is a prayer enough? I say yes. But I also say that we shouldn't stop there. We should encourage people to grow in their faith. Like the old hymn, "Come, Thou Fount " sings, "Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, Prone to leave the God I love;" But it goes on to sing, "Here's my heart, oh, take and seal it - Seal it for Thy courts above."

I'll leave the rest up to God. What do you say?

Keynote theme: Disciplemaking in a politically charged culture.

"Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it..." (Gen. 1:28a, NLT)

In all truthfulness, I have avoided all things "political." I figured it was someone else's job—those who were called and educated in that arena. It seemed too big to get my head around let alone find something helpful to contribute. So, I disengaged. Or so I thought.

The reality is I can't disengage. I live in community. Every community requires governance. I have opinions and beliefs, strong beliefs even of what I think would be good for everyone. I also have blind spots and need to be challenged in areas where I need to be more concerned about what would be helpful for my marginalized neighbors—those who are in need or may be different from me.

So in fact, I am "political". It would appear I just don't like *conflict*. The question for me becomes---

What does God really mean by "govern... subdue... reign...and be fruitful" in Gen. 1? As one who loves and follows Jesus, where do I find myself today in this world God intended for His Kingdom to reign in grace, love, truth, life, freedom.? What is my role? How am I to engage in a world that seems to have drifted so far from His purposes? How do I to respond? And how can I be better at navigating conflict that comes from living in the tension differences ultimately create?

This is the conversation our District will be having for Training Ground 2024. (See the Save-the Date flyer included in this newsletter). We have invited Kaitlyn Schiess to help us navigate this discussion. She will walk us through a Biblical framework on how political engagement fits into spiritual formation and the truth of the gospel. You can find more on Kaitlyn here: kaitlynschiess.com. Dave Linn and Sally Fry will fill out our adult track breakouts by presenting how to navigate conflict including within the church.
