Our son-in-law Rob Sutcliffe was involved in the counting of the elephants in Africa. Elephants without Borders, where Rob works was chosen to perform this amazing task.

Our part was helping the BBC crew with housing during the final filming. Due to the International Strong Man Competition, which by the way was won by an American, all the hotels were full! So the Honey Hotel came to the rescue! At the time, we were in Zambia holding a marriage seminar and work shop.

The marriage and family seminar and workshop we held in Zambia were a huge success! In fact, Fielden and Janet Allison who have been doing this for over 25 years, remarked that this was one of the best workshops ever held.



At Day Break near Lusaka, Zambia, we enjoyed the interest that the Bible school students, both married and single, showed in what we presented. The seminar is one of the courses that David and Lorie French require of the students in their school. This was our second year to teach there and we really enjoyed the group. We look forward to seeing these students next year.

From Lusaka, we drove down to Kalomo to Namwianga. There we held a workshop for 18 dedicated and very enthusiastic couples, plus seven who came without their spouse. These couples gave up a week of holiday to come to the workshop. We teach from 8 am to 4 pm with an hour or hour and a half for lunch. So their dedication to the workshop was fantastic! The couples had wonderful questions and during the talk on sexuality. which is culturally difficult for them in a mixed audience, they were willing to participate in the discussion. One dear sweet couple who came last year, and this year, told us afterwards that the work shop was amazing!





September in Botswana is officially dedicated as the month of prayer. Prayer for rain and prayer for AIDS victims and the infection rate to decline have been some of the most recent themes. Keith has spoken at the hospital, the court, the Tourism Department, the Information and Broadcasting Department and will speak at the Prisons and Agricultural Departments this year. It is wonderful to have the freedom to speak openly about our faith

to these government officials with their blessing!

Keith is about to open the Trucker's Chapel and there is much rejoicing in that. It will be a busy place and some of the young evangelists will help man the chapel when Keith is busy elsewhere. The trucker's ministry will move from the informal basis of walking the truck line to a more established one at the chapel.

In July, we traveled to Pandamatenga and baptized Keitumetse in the wonderful portable baptistry made by Danie Vorster one of the Christians in Kazungula. It was a cold winter day, but Keitumetse was overjoyed to become a child of God. We are praying that there will be others who desire this as well.
