Confession of Sin

Our Father,

Forgive our sins. Restore to us the joy of our salvation. And may we find great peace, great joy, and great assurance knowing that Jesus Christ died for us, that we might live with you.

Assurance of Forgiveness – 1 Peter 2:24-25 (ESV)

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. ²⁵ For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.

Exchange of Peace

Presider: Since God has forgiven and loved us in Christ, let us forgive and love one another. The peace of the Lord Jesus be with you all!

Congregation: Amen!

The Exchange of Peace is a deeply theological act. Having been reconciled to God, we are also reconciled to one another, and made part of the same body. By shaking hands and acknowledging the “peace of Christ,” we are acting out the unity that is ours in Christ, purchased at the cross, and lived out in the church.

We recognize as followers of the Lord Jesus those who have publicly professed their faith in Jesus Christ, and have been baptized. If this description fits you, you are welcome to celebrate the Lord's Supper with us. If not, we respectfully ask you to refrain from participating.

Once you have been served, please hold the elements until we can all partake together. Cups around the inner ring of the tray contain wine, cups around the outer ring contain grape juice.

“The Lord's Supper works for good. It is an emblem of the marriage supper of the Lamb, and an earnest of that communion we shall have with Christ in glory. It is a feast of fat things; it gives us bread from heaven, such as preserves life, and prevents death. It has glorious effects in the hearts of the godly. It quickens their affections, strengthens their graces, mortifies their corruptions, revives their hopes, and increases their joy.”
