Why Membership Matters: The Three C's

When I invite someone to consider becoming a member of MOPC, I am often met by a puzzled look. By the time I ask, they're already deeply involved: they attend worship, have joined a Bible study, or found a place to serve. So the question naturally comes:

"Why? I'm already involved. Why do I need to sign a piece of paper to make it official?"

Interestingly, it's the same question I get from couples who are cohabitating without a sense of need to ever get married: "Why do I need to sign a piece of paper? We're already committed."

At MOPC, we understand church membership as an invitation to live more deeply into your identity in Christ and your connection with God's people. In the Presbyterian tradition, membership is framed through the Three C's:

1. Covenant

Membership begins with God. Long before we choose the church, God has already chosen us and entered into covenant with us, promising, "I will be your God, and you will be my people" (Leviticus 26:12).

Through baptism, we are marked as God's own, and when we join the church, we respond to God's covenant love by making promises of our own — to worship, to grow in faith, and to follow Jesus within this community. Membership is our wholehearted "yes" to God's "ves."

This, by the way, is also where we get the idea of the Covenant of Marriage.

2. Commitment

Membership is a commitment to grow in faith, to serve with your gifts, and to remain connected to God and to one another. In a world where schedules shift and priorities compete, making space for worship, prayer, service, and fellowship forms us in lasting ways.

Each member is called to be a minister in their own way, offering time, talents, and presence. Through steady, intentional participation, membership shapes us and deepens our shared life together.

3. Community

The Apostle Paul describes the church as the body of Christ: "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it" (1 Corinthians 12:26). Membership places us within this living, breathing body where we support and strengthen one another.

We worship together, learn together, and serve together. We show up for each other in times of celebration and in times of need. Through these shared rhythms, membership nurtures relationships where God's presence becomes tangible.

What Membership Means in the PC(USA) Context

1. Entrance

The PC(USA) recognizes several forms of entry into membership:

- Public Profession of Faith (after a conversation with the session)
- Certificate of Transfer from another congregation
- Reaffirmation of Faith, for those previously baptized and professed in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

2. Ministry of Every Member

Membership is both a gift and a responsibility. PC(USA) calls members to:

- Proclaim Christ in word and action,
- · Participate fully in congregational life,
- Pray for and support one another,
- · Study scripture and living faith,
- Use time, talents, and resources in service,
- Promote justice and care for creation,
- Participate in church governance, and
- Regularly reflect on one's membership and ways to grow in participation in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

3. Belonging to Something Bigger

As part of the PC(USA), MOPC shares in a denominational heritage rooted in Reformed theology, representative leadership, and social commitment—dating back to the Reformation and enriched by a spirit of social justice, inclusion, and mission.

This vision empowers every person not just to belong—but to serve and contribute to the church's flourishing.

So, Why Join MOPC?

- You receive pastoral care, belonging, and opportunities to grow spiritually.
- You can influence decisions, serve in leadership, and participate in shaping the church's future.
- You'll partner in God's mission—locally and globally—through the broader PC (USA).
- You'll find deeper connection, rooted belonging, and meaningful ways to love God and neighbor.
- Membership at MOPC means embracing Covenant, Commitment, and Community—and becoming part of something larger still: the PC(USA)'s reach, history, and shared mission.




DINNERS FOR EIGHT

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, in *Life Together*, writes: "We belong to one another only through and in Jesus Christ... The Christian

needs another Christian who speaks God's Word to him... The Christ in his own heart is weaker than the Christ in the word of his brother; his own heart is uncertain, his brother's is sure."

This truth has been deeply real for me this past year. I've walked through the grief of losing a beloved grandmother, the joy of watching our daughter graduate, the shifts of a new job, the change of sending a child out of state, and the daily blessings and challenges of being a partner, parent, daughter, and friend. I imagine your year has been just as full—of both joy and hardship.

Through it all, I've been sustained by community: people who love me, know me, and walk beside me. They've celebrated, wept, prayed, and reminded me of who I am in Christ when my own faith felt weak. They haven't "fixed" my problems—they've simply been present. And that presence has been Christ to me.

At Mount Olympus, we are rich with opportunities for this kind of life together. Whether through Sunday worship, community groups, Parents' Café, Adult Discipleship classes, Presbyterian Women, or Men's Coffee, we practice being the Body of Christ for one another. My encouragement is this: don't miss the opportunity to receive this gift of community! And if you're unsure where to begin, I'd love to help you find your place.

The youth ministry year is off to a great start! On Sunday mornings, students gather for Devos and Donuts, a time to share in Scripture, reflection, and fellowship (with something sweet, of course). Then, during worship service, we invite our students to sit in the first two rows of the sanctuary. This is intentional—because our youth are not simply the future of the church, they are the church right now. Their presence, voices, and leadership matter deeply, and by placing them front and center, we affirm how much they are loved, valued, and essential to the life of our congregation.



Our small groups have also begun meeting on Wednesday nights, creating space for deeper conversation, prayer, and connection. The rhythm of these Wednesday night and Sunday morning programs helps our students grow in faith and in community together.



Children's Church (during both the 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m. services) and Sunday School (9:45 a.m.-10:45 a.m.) on Sunday mornings are wonderful opportunities for kids to grow in faith and community!
