CONFESSION OF SINS AND ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

- P: Beloved in the Lord, let us now take a moment to confess our sins to God our Father.
- C: Heavenly Father, I confess all my sins to You, the sins that I know of and I acknowledge that there are others that are unknown to me. Your Word teaches that I will be held accountable for my sins. But, Your Word also teaches me about Jesus and that He is the Savior of the world. Lord, I ask that You forgive me of my sins, that my sins not stay with me. "God, have mercy on me, a sinner" (Luke 18.13b).
