From the Pastor's Desk

On this second Sunday of Advent in the Gospel John the Baptist preaches repentance, as a way to experience salvation from God, "all the flesh shall see the salvation of God". Repentance comes from the word, "Metanoia", which means a change of life. It means stop living for ourselves, but for God and others which will make difference to our life.

Repentance or Metanoia concerns three areas of life, namely our relationship with God, our relationship to others and our relationship to self. About the first we are reminded, "You shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your strength". In others words we are supposed to love God above all things. We all have false gods, like material things, our own ego and our pride. God must be first in our lives and therefore we need to find time with God in prayer. The second thing we need to repent is the way we deal with others. Do we use other people as commodities for our own advantage? We are asked to love our neighbor as ourselves. We need to be concerned about making others happy and joyful. The third thing is not to focus on self. The purpose of Christian life is not to focus oneself, but forgetfulness of self. The more we empty ourselves, the more we received from God.

This advent is a God-given opportunity to reflect on three different areas of our life and experience real conversion and experience from God the salvation he wants to share in Christ.
