Dear First Friends,

A miracle is not the end of anything. Often, a miracle is the beginning of a lot of hard work. I shared that thought during my sermon last weekend, in reference to the miraculous catch of 153 fish after Jesus' resurrection. All of those fish were a wonderful miracle, yes, but something had to be done with all of those fish. The disciples couldn't leave the fish lying around while they did other things. No, they had to get the fish to the market or to the place where they could be processed and preserved with salt. The rest of the disciples' day, post-miracle, was full of a lot of hard, fishy work.

Our Christmas Eve offering was miraculous, to say the least. We raised enough money to provide over 108,000 meals! Just last month, one of the children of our church dug into their piggy bank and gave us another \$50 so that we could get even more meals. Miraculous! But now all of those meals need to be packed. On May 11 and 12, we need a total of 500 volunteers working two-hour shifts to pack all of those meals. The miraculous generosity of Christmas Eve now calls for a miraculous outpouring of workers to assist

Will you be part of our miracle-making? Anyone age 5 and over can join in the fun. There are even jobs that can be done while seated. You can sign up for two shifts if you'd like. Likewise, we stepped out in faith to host a traveling Summer Day Camp on our property during the first week of July. It will be a full day-camp experience, with lots of inflatables and fun camp activities. Best of all, this camp will provide a chance for children ages 6-13 to encounter Jesus in a new way. Do you have friends or neighbors that you feel led to invite to this camp? Be sure to sign them up as soon as possible, before we're full. Scholarship assistance is available if needed, so do not let the cost be a deterrent. I believe this camp offers a great opportunity for us to have an impact on the children of our community.

Yes, being on the receiving end of miracles can be a lot of work. The work is a joyous gift of God, but it is work nonetheless. Will you share in our joy in these coming months? Christ is working miracles through us, and there is plenty of work to go around.
