Please see below for the volunteer/donation needs we have for the first event:

Donations: We will have a donation board in the narthex for food donations and supplies. Please make sure when you take a note that you also mark it down on the clipboard.

Volunteers—We will have a volunteer sign-up sheet at the Information Table. Some of the volunteer jobs that we are needing are:

Setup—4–5:15 p.m. (this will include setting up tables and chairs; posting signs on the property; making sure we have plenty of trash cans; drink containers and condiments out on the tables)

Meal Preparation—4–5:30 p.m. (this will include prepping of all food, cooking, and plating)

Serving—5:15-6:30 p.m. (this will include taking the plates from the kitchen and serving them to our guests) **Hospitality**—5:15-6:45 p.m. (this will include walking around the gym, making sure people are comfortable, helping them to feel welcome and assisting them with additional needs if warranted)

Cleanup—5:30-7:15 p.m. (this is a shift that will start early and end when cleanup is over, including washing dishes as we go and packing leftovers if merited)

Dear First Friends,

As summer is drawing to an end, I want to offer you a special invitation to join our VILLAGE literacy volunteers in this school year. As you'll see elsewhere in our newsletter, we are preparing for another great year working with children on their reading skills in the Blue Springs School District. Bishop Farr is encouraging every church in Missouri to partner with their local schools to offer literacy tutoring. He believes that we can have a significant impact on poverty in Missouri if we can increase the reading abilities of children. The great news is that our pilot program

last spring was extremely successful! We had 25 volunteers in classrooms, affecting the lives of over 50 children in Blue Springs. Our goal for this new school year is to double that number of volunteers to 50 for the 2018-2019 school year. Won't you help us achieve this lofty goal? By giving one hour a week, you may change the course of a child's life.

In fact, one of our goals with the transition to our new single-board governance model is precisely what you see above. By decreasing the number of people that must spend hours each month in administrative meetings, we hope to increase the number of people involved directly in hands-on ministry. Our new Leadership Council held its first official meeting in July, and the transition has gone very smoothly. We have been working together for a couple of months in preparation, training, and goal-setting. This Leadership Council has hit the ground running, and I believe that we have an extremely strong group of servant leaders who love Jesus and who care deeply about First UMC. If you have any questions for this group, I feel confident that any one of them would be glad to talk with you. Randy Williams is chair, and other members have nametags that identify them as Leadership Council members.

Finally, I want to take some time to offer a deep and sincere word of appreciation for the leadership of Bob Blaine. He served as Chair of our former Church Council, and his guidance was key to transitioning to this new Leadership Council model. Bob helped us over some bumps in the process, and his generosity of time and spirit enabled us to get us to where we are. In essence, Bob did a great job working himself out of a job! I am so grateful for all that Bob has given to our congregation through his years of service. Thank you, Bob, well done!

I look forward to being back home in Blue Springs after my vacation. I'll be back in the pulpit the weekend of August 11/12. In the meantime, I know that you are being blessed by the preaching ministry of Erika Braun.
