You see, while our own students will soon begin their summer breaks, I'll be making sure my shoes are tied, bags are packed, and that my lunch is packed. I'm headed back to school. I was recently accepted into the Doctor of Ministry program at San Francisco Theological Seminary in the Executive

Leadership cohort. Specifically, I'll focus on the role of the pastor in the community and how the pastor can work alongside other city leaders to affect change, while also respecting the separation of church and state. Classes begin in June.

Now, before you start worrying, or celebrating, I'm not moving to California. This degree is for people who are working fulltime in ministry and will take about 5 years to complete. The program is structured so that I'll have face-to-face classes in San Francisco a week at a time two or three times each year. The rest of the coursework will be completed online.

And the continual pursuit of deeper and broader knowledge is expected. For it is when we continue to engage our soul, body, and mind that we broaden our awareness to the movement of God.

So this month, as we celebrate our high school and higher learning graduates, I'll whisper a prayer of thanksgiving for their tenacity on completing their respective degree. I'll pray that they'll use their new knowledge to make the Kingdom of God more fully alive. And I'll pray for my own journey, that by the end of this chapter, Holmeswood will be more equipped to be the church that God continues to call us to be at 97th and Holmes.

Mission Moment

In the next few months, the Mission Council will be featuring our ongoing ministries in the Center community. We have four Center District "closets" utilized by Center social workers and community members. These are the Food Pantry, Clothes Closet, School Supply Room, and Furniture Room. Another long-standing and weekly ministry is Pray and Play.

Below is an interview with Greg Smedley, the ministry leader of Pray and Play. The interviewer is Erin McDaniel, Mission Council member.

Erin: I'm here today with Greg Smedley to talk about Pray and Play. So, Greg, tell me a little about Pray and Play and the ministry that you do here.

Greg: Pray and Play is all about basketball, mainly. We usually start about 6:30-7:00pm, and we do a devotion that lasts between 5-10 minutes. Then, we begin playing basketball. They're pretty much pick-up games, and we just fellowship with each other. Sometimes the games get a little intense, but it all works out in good fun

Erin: How did you get involved in Pray and Play?

Greg: I got involved many years ago; I'm guessing probably 15-17 years ago. Steve Karnes and I had a basketball league here that we used to do, and after the basketball league was over, people were still interested in coming up here and playing. So Steve Karnes started Pray and Play, and I tagged along with him doing it. Then, of course, his family moved away so I just continued doing it.

Erin: What is your favorite part about Pray and Play?

Greg: Honestly, my favorite part is playing basketball. I really do enjoy playing basketball. It's a sport I've enjoyed since I was little,



and I always thought that I was good at it. I don't know if I'm that good at it or not, but it's almost a time of fellowship for myself. In a way, it's a devotional time for myself. When we're supposed to be quiet with God in our lives, sometimes I'll come in here (the gym) and shoot baskets by myself. It's kind of my quiet time. So in a way, this gymnasium that you see back here, that I've been associated with pretty much my entire time at Holmeswood, is kind of my worship center. I get a lot out of it through that worship and through playing basketball.

Erin: What can the church do to help support this ministry?

Greg: Well, this facility is extremely important to myself and this ministry. And keeping this facility up and running has been helping out a lot- the new basketball goals we've got on the sides, keeping our gym floor nice, this new carpet that we got, the tile upstairs, this whole building and the way we're taking care of it. So I would have to say just keeping our facility up is the most important. And, if someone would like to come up and introduce themselves to some of the guys, if they're comfortable with that, they're more than welcome to come join us.


NEW BOOK IN THE LIBRARY FOR PRESCHOOL CHILDREN


