
Connecting our Story

FROM THE PASTOR

People of Bethlehem,

Recently a bumper sticker on a horse trailer caught my attention: "Do you follow Jesus this close?"

I imagine this question is intended to prompt people to ponder both their driving and their devotion. It is a question that fits well with our worship series: *Dust: Follow Jesus Closely*.

In Jesus' time there was a saying: "Be covered in the dust of your rabbi." Disciples were to follow their teacher's footsteps so closely that they'd be covered in the dust that the rabbi's feet kicked up. This is a powerful image of a teacher's influence on student's lives.

Summer is often thought of as a break from school, and summer is not a vacation from following Jesus. When pondering Jesus' teaching, we could look to his Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) or his teaching in his hometown synagogue (Luke 4:16–19):

When [Jesus] came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

Perhaps you have other "dust" of Jesus that shapes your life. Please share your favorites as we may include yours as part of our upcoming *My Favorite Scripture* series in August.

As the voices of many rabbis and leaders flood our ears, let's follow Jesus closely enough to hear his teaching.

I look forward to listening to Jesus with you this summer and beyond!
