LENTEN BOOK STUDY 2026 WITH PASTOR MATT

In 2025, I started a new rhythm of doing a book study during Lent. I'm delighted to share that I will be leading another book study for Lent 2026! Last year's book on Dietrich Bonhoeffer was both rich and difficult to read. This year's book is different; it is more accessible for a wider audience, but still contains a powerful and deep message for us. If I could choose one book (outside of the Bible) for everyone in the congregation to read, this would be the one.

The Book of Forgiving by Desmond and Mpho Tutu is an exceptional book on the topic of forgiveness. Desmond Tutu served as archbishop of South Africa, and was the recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984. He and his son, Mpho, talk about why forgiveness is essential for us as individuals, and the world as a whole, to find healing. If you are struggling to forgive someone, or even yourself, this book is for you. If you are a victim or a perpetrator seeking healing and restoration, this book is for you. If you want a faithful and flexible guide to help you walk towards forgiveness, this book is for you.

FROM THE PASTOR

Beloved Children of God,

As I'm writing this, we recently celebrated our tradition of Remembrance of Baptism. We come and see Jesus, that he is the son of God, beloved, with whom God is well pleased (Matthew 3:17). As we come and see everything through Jesus, we see that each of us – and indeed each and every person – is a child of God, beloved, with whom God is well pleased. This profound good news is life-changing.

Following his baptism and time in the wilderness, Jesus begins his public ministry. As Matthew tells it: "Jesus began to proclaim, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near'" (4:17). Jesus then invites some fishermen on the shores of the Sea of Galilee to follow him. Then "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people" (3:23).

As we *come and see* Jesus teaching about the kingdom of heaven, how does that help us to see our everyday lives?

As we follow Jesus in Matthew's gospel, we see him as the master teacher about the kingdom of heaven. Jesus' first major teaching is often called "The Sermon on the Mount," and begins with the Beatitudes. Jesus proclaims blessing upon those who are experiencing hardship under another kingdom.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.

Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Matthew 5:3–9

I invite you to join me in prayerfully pondering the Beatitudes and Jesus' entire teaching in the Sermon on the Mount. As a family of God journeying together, seeking to follow Jesus, let us together learn from him. Let us together learn how to live as citizens of the kingdom of heaven right here and now.

I look forward to worshipping together with you as we continue to come and see Jesus.

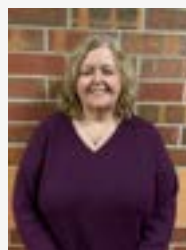

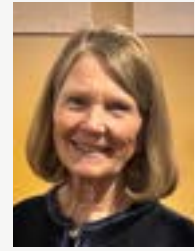
