In August I had the opportunity to travel to Germany with my son, my wife and mother-in-law. My mother-in-laws parents came from Germany in the 1930s. Together we experienced some of the amazing beauty of Germany, the warmth and love of the people, and the horrible history. Often, while walking in residential neighborhoods, we would see bronze "stumbling-stones" in the walkways. Each bronze "stumbling-stone" was engraved with the name and information about someone forcibly removed from the adjacent home or apartment by the Nazis. This practice of placing the "stumbling-stones" is partially inspired by a passage from the Talmud (the central text of Judaism that includes rabbinic discussions of Jewish scriptures and history). These are the profound words from the Talmud:

A person is only forgotten when their name is forgotten.

This ancient Jewish wisdom now is engraved on a stone at the entrance of Bethlehem's Remembrance Walkway.

As you read this newsletter, I invite you to **remember people who have impacted your life and faith journey**. What are their names? How did they, and how do they still, shape your faith and life?

I invite you to share in All Saints worship at Bethlehem. Light a candle and say their names as you thank God for their love and witness. Share in Holy Communion and rest in the promise that the Communion of Saints holds us all in God's amazing grace.

# GREETINGS FROM PASTORAL CARE

#### A Season to Embrace a Prayerful Rhythm

As we approach the season of Advent, the calendar seems to quicken its pace—events, errands, and expectations pile up. But Advent, at its heart, invites us into a different rhythm—a holy slowing down. It's not about doing more, but about preparing our hearts with intentional pauses for prayer, reflection, and rest.

This year, we invite you to consider just this---not to escape the noise, but to find the kind of stillness that renews. Perhaps a quiet moment of prayer before your feet hit the floor. A few deep breaths and a short scripture reading at lunch. A pause at day's end to reflect on where God showed up in unexpected ways.

These pauses are not marks of laziness or underachievement. They are quiet spaces where refreshing momentum is born. We are created to thrive not through constant motion, but through rhythm—through rest.

We invite you not to rush through this Advent, but rather embrace God's invitation for Sabbath to pause and be renewed. Relish a nap. Welcome a daydream. Take time to pray. These quiet moments may be the sacred pauses your spirit needs—not distractions from your purpose, but part of God's deeper rhythm for your life.
