

## D — Dreams

God cares about every need that exists on earth — every hurt, every brokenness, and every lost person. But God knows that such expansive caring is beyond our human-ness. That is why God places a dream (a desire, a passion, an interest, a calling) in each of our hearts. Our dream helps to define the sphere in which our gifts can function best.

Our dreams are often about helping a particular people group (e.g. the elderly), advancing a particular cause (e.g. relieving hunger), or exercising a particular function in a helping way (e.g. mentoring). The list to the right is meant to help you begin thinking about where your dream lies. Your dreams are another element of your S.T.R.I.D.E. profile that often change based on your season of life or your life experiences. For instance, you may be very passionate about working with teenagers, but faced with an aging parent with Alzheimer's, find yourself becoming more focused on helping others cope with that issue. In the end, as with our gifts, we discover our dreams through trying various areas of service, and finding the one(s) that give us the greatest joy, fulfillment and effectiveness. Please check the list of dreams to the right and check all that apply. Remember, this isn't a complete list of possible dreams. Write yours in if it's not listed here.

## E — Experiences

Good or bad, our experiences have made us who we are today. As we look at life through the eyes of God, we come to understand that God's gracious, healing touch can use all of our experiences to prepare us for service. Our pain can help us minister to others in pain. Our success can give hope and direction to others who are failing. All of our experiences — family, work, ministry, relationships, circumstances — are building blocks God can use to equip us to serve. So review your life experiences, and prayerfully ask God to guide you in using those experiences to bless others.

And there you have it — a quick outline of how you can find your S.T.R.I.D.E. for service to God and others. There is, of course, more to learn, and the real fun of the process comes in actually getting involved in service, "getting our hands dirty" for God.

# Hitting Your S.T.R.I.D.E.

*He has given each one of us a special gift through the generosity of Christ... Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers. Their responsibility is to equip God's people to do his work and build up the church, the body of Christ. He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love.*

One key membership expectation at the Church of the Resurrection is that each member will give time and energy in service to others. That expectation is based on four foundational Bible passages: Romans 12: 1-8, 1 Corinthians 12-14, Ephesians 4: 1-16 and 1 Peter 4: 8-11. However, it can be hard to decide where and how we will serve. There are so many good and important ministries. Not even the most dedicated Christian can possibly respond to all of the calls that cross our path. The question is, how shall we choose?

Our answer is a process we call S.T.R.I.D.E., which stands for:

**T**alents

**R**esources

**I**ndividuality

**D**reams

**E**xperiences

Just as you cannot fit a square peg into a round hole (at least, not without doing a lot of damage), you cannot fit all people into the same ministry positions. Every position, and every person, is unique. The purpose of the S.T.R.I.D.E. process is to help you understand how God has created you, and to help you find an area of service that fits you well.

This guide will introduce you to the S.T.R.I.D.E. process, and help you start down the path of meaningful service. There is much we can't cover here — please consider this the beginning of your journey, not the end! As the Holy Spirit urges you to learn more, and deepen your understanding of how God has equipped you to serve, the church offers Spiritual Gifts classes several times a year, as well as personal consultations and support from the Guest Services office. You'll want to check them out at the appropriate time. But for now, let's get started!

## S — Spiritual Gifts

In a nutshell, here are some of the main things the Bible teaches us about spiritual gifts:

- Every Christian (yes, even YOU) has one or more God-given spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 12:7)
- Spiritual gifts are given, not for personal improvement or profit, but to serve others (1 Peter 4:10)
- God, not us, chooses which spiritual gifts we receive (1 Corinthians 12:18)
  - We're each gifted to fill a different place in God's service – both envy and ego are ruled out
  - Only as we all do our unique parts will the church achieve its God-intended effectiveness
- The Church operates like our body, with each part doing its special function, and all directed by the Head (Jesus Christ) (Romans 12:4-8)

**So which spiritual gifts has God given you?** Ultimately, the best way to discover that is to “try out” various service areas. Those areas in which you are most effective, that bring you the most joy, and in which you receive the greatest support and confirmation from fellow Christians will be the ones in which God has gifted you to serve. Use this guide to narrow the options so you can focus your choice of which service areas you want to try out.

Here's an exercise to help you start thinking about which gifts God may have given you. Listed on the adjacent page are some of the gifts identified in Scripture that are often used in service at Church of the Resurrection. Under each gift's name is a word or phrase that indicates its contribution to the church along with a list of words that are often descriptive of people having that gift. If five or more words on a list are true of you, you may have received that gift. To further explore the gifts you may have, ask one or more Christian friends or family members who know you well to do the same process for you, without knowing your answers.

## T — Talents

Everyone (not just Christians) is born with natural talents. We may also develop talents through workplace experiences, schooling, and in other ways. God often takes our talents and uses them with our spiritual gifts. To help you assess your talents, prayerfully study the list to the left (which is just a sampling) and check all that apply.

## R — Resources

The word “resources” may bring finances to mind, but our resources also include our time, our contacts, our hobbies and many other things. Our time is one of the most critical elements of the S.T.R.I.D.E. profile to consider when looking for a place to serve. The time you have available will vary greatly depending on your season of life. Parents with young children will likely have less available time to serve than single persons, empty-nesters or retirees. God calls us to be good stewards of the time that we do have, and to use it in serving one another, but we also have to balance that with the demands of our life stage. God doesn't want us to burn out!

Jesus urged us to “store up for yourselves treasures in heaven.” (Matthew 6:20) In other words, He called on us to find ways to invest our earthly resources in things that have eternal value. This is an important part of our service profile: how am I using my resources? How could I use them more effectively to advance God's Kingdom?

## I — Individuality

Are you a “big picture” person, or do you like to work out every detail of a project? Which is harder — being with 12 other church members discussing a need, or being alone writing a proposal about that need? It's important to understand your individuality — the way that you work best.

There are many ways to understand personal styles. For S.T.R.I.D.E., we work with two dimensions: one axis from Extrovert (energized through interaction with people) to Introvert (energized by reflection, usually alone), and the other from Stable (prefer deadlines, structure, accountability and systems) to Flexible (focused on goals, preferring to leave details to be worked out). This produces four basic styles:

- Extrovert/Stable:** likes clearly-defined relationships, warm, thoughtful, loyal, trusting
- Extrovert/Flexible:** spontaneous, enthusiastic, fun, inspirational, welcomes change
- Introvert/Stable:** quiet, reflective, practical, thorough, fact-oriented
- Introvert/Flexible:** prefers general guidelines, self-confident, competitive, risk-taking, visionary

Few people are “pure” examples of just one style, but most of us can identify one of these four styles that seems to describe us best. Seek ministry opportunities that are a good fit for your style.
