From the Pastor

New year, new perspective

Did you make a new year's resolution this year? Will this be the year you get in shape or read more books or finally get the checking account under control? Have you committed to take the plunge on that new career move or business idea? Maybe you've given up sugar or soda? Even if you didn't make an "official" resolution, for most of us the new year brings with it a sense of possibility and progress. That's why we make resolutions, right? As the calendar turns from December to January, there is a feeling of having a fresh start, an opportunity—and a desire to do something worthwhile with it.

If you made a resolution of your own, I wish you all the best in it! Might I suggest one to add to your list? And if, like me, you didn't make one at all you can get in on this, too. Here's my proposal for your new year's resolution: **Make 2021 the year you start to intentionally look for God's kingdom around you!** Why? The same cloud that lingered over us in 2020—the seclusion, the cancelled traditions, the fear, the powerlessness—has followed us into 2021; that's reality right now whether we like it or not. At the same time, here's what Martin Luther said about God's kingdom as he explained the meaning behind the Lord's Prayer: It comes whether we pray for it or not—but we pray "thy kingdom come" in order that it might come among us.

In other words, God's kingdom is there whether we recognize it or not. But, the more you start looking for it the better it will be for you. That's because the more you start looking for it, the more you'll start to see it—all the ways God is at work *even in the midst* of this difficult situation—and how you can join in!

So how might you look for God's kingdom—for the restorative things God is "up to" even while the effects of sin rage all around us? Here are a few thoughts for you...

Start with Grace! Most New Year's resolutions are hard, "un-fun" work: you have to run (yuck!) or give up foods you like and eat kale instead (double yuck: kale is a weed). This one isn't. In fact there's *nothing* you need to do here. The kingdom comes whether you and I look for it or not, remember? That's because God does the "hard work," the kingdom work, of unraveling the effects of sin in our world. By your baptism, you're of that kingdom whether you look for it or not—you're already made new, as Paul says (2 Corinthians 5:17). So there's no "have to" here; you're good enough in God's eyes just the way you are.

Look to Jesus. One of the things I noticed right away when I came to CLC—that I LOVE by the way!—is that there are no "church members" here; we're disciples! You probably know that a "disciple" is one who follows, learns from, and imitates a teacher. For us, that teacher is Jesus. If you want to see God's kingdom among you, follow Jesus: Read about Him in Scripture, learn about Him in worship or a Bible study. Notice what kinds of things Jesus does, who He encounters, and how He responds; then start to watch for those same kinds of people and opportunities in *your* daily life.

By the way, look beyond "neediness". It's easy to see opportunities to join in God's work when a person is hungry or can't pay the rent. Those are valuable ways to help, but "kingdom work" goes beyond that. Look to Jesus: We see him interacting with—and assisting—not only people who are hungry, but also people who are lonely, who are cast out for being "different", and people who have made some mistakes. And He's there to celebrate what's going well, too! It's not all about financial need.

Talk about it with others. One of the best ways to see where God is at work—and where He might be inviting you to join in—is by talking about it with other disciples you trust. That can happen over dinner (a much more interesting conversation than the typical "How was your day? Fine."), in a small group (please reach out if we can help you get connected!), or just with a friend over coffee. Try these two questions for starters: Where did you see God at work today? And, what opportunities for doing good did you notice today? Both of these will get you well on the way to noticing what God is doing around you and how you can be a part of it.

God is with you as this new year begins, and He will be through every day and hour of it. That's true whether you and I "notice" it or not. But what joy and peace—not to mention purpose—await if we can train ourselves more and more to notice that comforting reality! Start by giving yourself grace, then "follow" Jesus through His word, look for the things you see Him being involved in, and talk about it with other disciples you trust. As you do, you'll start to see so much more than the bleak scenario we face now; you'll see God working in it through you and for you!

Having a “Clearer Vision”

We are hoping for better things in 2021. We want to have a clearer vision forward and leave behind some of the difficulty of 2020. Whether or not that is possible, our eyes of faith see clearly through the present into the reality of Jesus Christ born to save us.

Jan. 9/10 – “Seeing the Signs” (Matt. 2:1-12)

The magi saw the star and believed that it was a sign from God. This sign led them to the Christ child. When they saw Him, they worshiped. We are still led by God to see His Son. The sign might be more ordinary, but the sight of Jesus our Savior is no less remarkable!

Jan. 16/17 – “Don’t Be Deceived” (1 Cor. 6:12-20)

There are many forces at work in your life who are seeking to divert your eyes away from Jesus. The devil would have you see anything *but* Jesus. Christians acknowledge these deceits and follow a different path, the path that glorifies God.

Jan. 23/24 – “Others to Help You See” (Hebrews 12:1-3)

When we are unable to see clearly, God gives us community. From the calling of the first disciples to the reminder of the great cloud of witnesses that surrounds us, we are in the community of the



church. We are eyes for each other, focusing on Jesus together.

Jan. 30/31 – “Seeing Jesus” (Mark 1:21-28)

What more is there to do but fix our eyes on Jesus? We see a glorious vision—of the one who was foretold, the one who had authority unlike any other. Jesus lived, died, rose, ascended, and reigns as our Savior now and forever.

Feb. 6/7 – “Seeing the World Differently” (1 Cor. 9:16-27)

Once our view of Jesus is clear, the world is seen in a different light. No longer is the world something to be feared. Instead, it is something to be redeemed and overcome. The purpose is clear, that through us God might save!




