From the Pastor

Away in a Manger

It seems that we are always dreaming about the ideal Christmas. We even tend to run ourselves ragged trying to make that dream a reality. But oftentimes, the Christmas we dream about is better than the one we experience.

Ponder the Christmas shepherds. They were near the bottom of the social ladder in their day. Their job required constant vigilance, long days, and lonesome nights under the open sky. It left them smelly and messy day in and day out. How miserable!

But these shepherds were recipients of an honor no king or emperor ever had. They alone were given the angel's message: *"I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord"* (Luke 2:10-11).

Not only was this news that they were privileged to hear, it was a moment that they were invited to see! *"Lying in a manger"*, the angel said, would be the place where they would find Him. *So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger* (Luke 2:16).

The news was life-saving, and the sight was life-changing. *When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child ...The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and*

seen, which were just as they had been told (Luke 2:17,20).

My friends, the true joy of Christmas is waiting to be experienced anew as we simply gaze upon the baby lying in the manger. This is the face of him who bore the sorrows and the burdens of all the world in his own heart. This is the One who took all our sin and brokenness into his own body in his death on the cross. This is the One who rose victorious over Satan, sin, and death so that we might have life now and forevermore.

The ideal Christmas is not something we need to dream about. It is not something that we need to manufacture. God has already taken care of it all for us. The ideal Christmas is right here, right now—*lying in a manger*.

Therefore, in these days, let us continue to not only ponder these Christmas

shepherds, but let us also join with them in saying: *"Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about"* (Luke 2:15).


