From the Pastor

Let's get a little antsy!

During one of our mission trips to Panama, we had the opportunity to take a walk through a heavily forested area. At one point, we noticed that we were not the only ones walking the path. Parallel to our route was a rather lengthy "two-lane ant highway," and it was rush hour. One outgoing stream of ants was scurrying towards a destination unknown, while the incoming procession was heading to the colony.

Upon closer examination, we could see that each incoming ant was carrying something. Not one returned to the colony empty-handed. Some of their treasures seemed small, miniscule to our eyes, while others were laboring to maneuver much larger fortunes along the trail. From our perspective, the size of each prize was tiny, almost worthless. But the culmination of even the smallest effort contributed to a rich harvest for the colony.

The Apostle Paul reminds us:
"...in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. ...If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him

give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully." (Romans 6:5-8) Paul also writes:
"From [Christ] the whole body... grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." (Ephesians 4:16)

Each one of us is needed and necessary in the work and ministry of our Lord Jesus Christ. We all bring bundles of different sizes and shapes. We bring treasures of music and mercy, of love and loveliness, of grace and glory, of leadership and service. We come as teachers and encouragers, caregivers and counselors, servants and pray-ers, singers and musicians, preachers and custodians, builders and maintainers, leaders and supporters.


Baptized into God's Family



Collections & Donations

CLC Collections Ministry's focus for 2019

"For I was hungry and you gave me food... I was naked and you clothed me." ~ Matthew 25:35-36

Do you ever wonder how you can best provide for those in need? CLC Collections Ministry has been providing food and clothing for those in need for many years. In 2019 we are focusing on strengthening our partnership with Shepherd Community Center and Lutheran Child and Family Services (LCFS).

Food collections

We collect food at all our sites in bins located outside worship areas. All food donated this year will be given to The Sharing Place, the food pantry of (LCFS). The Sharing Place serves people in need in nine zip codes in the Indianapolis area. When we deliver food to this pantry, the recipients are both grateful and excited to see items they so desperately need. While all food and personal care items are appreciated, items specifically needed include: canned veggies/fruit/fish/meat, feminine hygiene products, laundry detergent, pasta and canned sauce, rice/beans, toothpaste/brushes, peanut butter & jelly, toilet paper, and diapers. When you are doing your usual shopping please remember those who cannot afford even the basics and pick up an extra item or two to bring with you when you come to worship. This is a great ministry for your children to start understanding how we serve Jesus by serving others. Our grandchildren have a lot of fun helping us take food to people who are hungry!

Clothing collections

We collect gently-used clothing at our Carmel site in a marked cabinet across from room 100. These items are taken to Shepherd Community Center. The donated clothes will either be used directly to clothe the needy or, if there is not a need for the specific items, will be given to Goodwill. In exchange for these donations, Goodwill provides vouchers that can be used at any Goodwill store to purchase items needed by the people served by Shepherd. For each 13-gallon trash bag of clothes, Goodwill gives Shepherd a \$5 voucher. Recently these vouchers were used to help a family who lost all of their possessions in a fire obtain some furniture they desperately needed. Please think of this ministry when you are cleaning out your closets. Your old clothes can be a wonderful blessing to someone in need! Right now the specific needs at Shepherd are clothes from newborn to size 4T.






