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The Glory of God (6:9) "Hallowed be Your name."

- We are to ask God to so work in our world that his name will be set apart, treated as holy, or glorified.
- Pray, "God, sanctify or set apart or glorify your person and anything by which you have made yourself known."



The Glory of God (6:9) "Hallowed be Your name."

- Ask God to help you always speak about Him & His holy things with reverence.
- Praise, adore, and thank God for who He is and what He has done.
- Ask God to use His Word to ensure that you think rightly about Him.
- Ask God to cause those in your life who don't believe, to respond in faith to Jesus Christ and His gospel—for His glory.
- Ask God to enable you and others to bring Him glory by living lives of righteousness and faithful service.
- Tell God that you want to set His name apart by loving other Christians & ministering to them.
- Ask God to help you and others glorify Him by trusting Him even in our trials and persecution.
- Commit to live your life not for your own peace, comfort, or pleasure, but for God's glory.

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing (v. 1)

Come, Thou Fount of every blessing,
Tune my heart to sing Thy grace;
Streams of mercy, never ceasing,
Call for songs of loudest praise.
Teach me some melodious sonnet,
Sung by flaming tongues above;
Praise His name—I'm fixed upon it—
Name of God's redeeming love.

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing (v. 2)

Hither-to Thy love has blessed me;
Thou hast brought me to this place;
And I know Thy hand will bring me
Safely home by Thy good grace.
Jesus sought me when a stranger,
Wandering from the fold of God;
He, to rescue me from danger,
Bought me with His precious blood.

Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing (v. 3)

O to grace how great a debtor
Daily I'm constrained to be!
Let Thy goodness, like a fetter,

The Kingdom of God (6:10)
"Your kingdom come."

- It simply refers to the rule and reign of God.
- But there are two aspects of this kingdom.
 - 1) The Present Aspect
 - It's a spiritual kingdom, the spiritual rule of God in the hearts of everyone who repents and believes in His Son (Col. 1:13).
 - When we pray, "your kingdom come", we are praying that the current spiritual kingdom will advance.
 - 2) The Future Aspect
 - Jesus will physically return to this earth and set up a literal kingdom on the earth (Rev. 20:1-6).
 - When we pray, "your kingdom come", we are asking God that the Second Coming come soon.

The Kingdom of God (6:10)
"Your kingdom come."

- Ask God to use you and others in our church to share the gospel message with someone this week.
- Tell God that this week you will seek to make God's kingdom your top priority; pray that for the rest of our church family.
- Express your willingness to make personal sacrifices to advance the kingdom.
- Ask the Lord to return soon for us.

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The Will of God (6:10)

"Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

- To genuinely pray "your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" is to pray that God would affect **three spiritual results**:
 - Deliberate Rejection of Every Will But God's
 - Unconditional Acceptance of God's Sovereign Will
- To pray "your will be done" means we are accepting God's sovereign will without qualification or argumentation.
 - Willing Obedience to God's Revealed Will
- A significant part of this petition is that we and all mankind would obey God's commands (his revealed will) in the same way they are obeyed in heaven.

The Will of God (6:10)

"Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

- Unconditional acceptance of God's Sovereign will
 - Pray for God's sovereign will to be accomplished in the world, in our country, and in our church.
 - Pray for God's will in the big decisions and issues of your life and the lives of others you know.
 - Pray for a willing acceptance of God's will in our outward successes or failures, riches or poverty, health or sickness, marriage or singleness, joy or sorrow, ease and comfort or troubles and trials, life or death."
 - Pray for an acceptance of the daily circumstances and providences of life.
- Willing obedience to God's revealed will
 - Pray that you and all those you know will be:
 - 1) Saved (1 Tim. 2:3; 2 Pet. 3:9)
 - 2) Filled with the Spirit (Eph. 5:17)
 - 3) Sanctified (1 Th. 4:3)
 - 4) Submit to authority (1 Pet. 2:13)
 - 5) Show gratitude (1 Th. 5:18)
 - 6) Be willing to suffer for the sake of Christ (2 Tim. 3:12; 1 Pet. 4:19)

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The Needs of Life (6:11)
"Give us this day our daily bread."

- When we pray "give us our daily bread", we should be praying that God would supply the needs of this life for:
 - 1) our own families (1 Tim. 5:4, 8)
 - 2) other believers (Acts 6:1; Gal. 6:10; Jam. 2:15-16; 1 John 3:17-18)
 - 3) all those in need (Gal. 6:10; cf. Eph. 4:28).

The Needs of Life (6:11)
"Give us this day our daily bread."

- Ask God to keep you and your fellow Christians humble and dependent on Him each day.
- Ask God to give us all those things necessary to physical life and existence: e.g., food, clothing, shelter, health, physical strength, strong mind, gainful employment.
- Tell God that you are content with your circumstances and seek his forgiveness where you aren't.
- Thank God for His overwhelming provision for you, your family, this church.
- And thank Him for His promise to always meet our needs in the future.

Refiner's Fire (verse 1)

Purify my heart,
Let me be as gold
And precious silver.
Purify my heart,
Let me be as gold,
Pure gold.

Refiner's Fire (chorus)

Refiner's fire,
My heart's one desire is to be holy;
Set apart for You, Lord.
I choose to be holy,
Set apart for You, my Master;
Ready to do Your will.

Refiner's Fire (verse 2)

Purify my heart,
Cleanse me from within
And make me holy.
Purify my heart,
Cleanse me from my sin,
Deep within.

Refiner's Fire (chorus)

Refiner's fire,
My heart's one desire is to be holy;

The Forgiveness of Sin (6:12)

“And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.”

- To pray this petition requires three heart responses...
 - Acknowledge the Reality of our Sinfulness
 - Understand the Nature of Forgiveness
 - When you and I come to God every day, asking His forgiveness for our sins, we are approaching our own Father, and we are asking Him to forgive our debts against him and to restore—not our *relationship*, he remains our Father—but to restore our *fellowship* with Him.
 - And to do it solely because of what Christ did on the cross.
 - Meet the Condition of Forgiveness
 - Scripture says that we owe everyone who sins against us two things:
 - 1) a spirit or attitude of forgiveness Matt. 5:7; Luke 23:34; Acts 7:60; Rom. 12:19-20).
 - 2) Full and complete restoration when there is repentance (Matt. 18:21-35; Luke 17:3-4; Eph. 4:32; Col. 3:13; cf. Gen. 50:15-21

The Forgiveness of Sin (6:12)

“And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.”

- In 1 John 1:9, there are several very practical directives.
- 1) Confess all specific sins (*our sins*).
 - Omission – failing to obey God’s law; to perfectly love God and others
 - Commission – choosing actively to sin in thought, attitude, word, and action
- 2) Accept full responsibility (*confess* means “to say the same thing”).
- 3) Plead the character of God (*he is faithful*).
- 4) Thank God that Christ on the cross earned your forgiveness (“He is...just”; cf. Rom. 3:26 – *just and the justifier*).
- 5) Expect complete forgiveness (“He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness”).

Take My Life (v 1)

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Growth in Holiness

“And do not lead us into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.”

- “Lead us not into temptation” – asking God to keep us from any temptation that would cause us to fall.
- “But deliver us from evil” – asking God to bless our efforts at obedience so that we see a decreasing pattern of sin and an increasing pattern of holiness.

Growth in Holiness

“And do not lead us into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.”

- “Lead us not into temptation” – ask God to work through providence to keep you and others from any temptation to which we might succumb or that would cause us to fall.
- “But deliver us from evil” – ask God to providentially direct our lives and our circumstances and to bless our efforts at obedience in order that we all see a decreasing pattern of sin and an increasing pattern of holiness.
