KAMP FEES:

Kamp Kaleidoscope is a weekly day camp program offering 10 weeks of exciting learning opportunities and lots of fun! You can register for all 10 weeks or just the camps that spark your interest! Tuition is charged on a bi-weekly basis.

Tuition fees:

5 days \$200

2 days flex \$120

3 days flex \$165

Extra day \$50

Upon registration, it is expected that you select which weeks and days your camper will be attending. After camp starts, weeks may not be switched but can be added when available. Please note that once registered, you will be charged for those weeks (and any added weeks), regardless of your child's attendance. It is the parent's responsibility to keep current on tuition payments, including any late fees assessed (\$25 per week). ACH is the standard method of payment. Cash/check payments will be an additional \$15/week for 3-5 days and \$10/week for 2 days. Credit/debit cards will be an additional \$13/week for 3-5 days and \$10/week for 2 days. Non-refundable registration fees are \$10 per week per camper.

Parents of **part-time Flex** campers have the convenience and flexibility of selecting different days of attendance each week, but will need to confirm which days by the prior week. This is necessary in order for Kamp staff to secure safe transportation, necessary tickets, and required staffing for all children in attendance each day. Sign-ups for field trips is first-come-first-served and due to tickets and transportation we may reach maximum capacity and not be able to accommodate all students. Last minute changes in days of attendance may result in charges for extra days.

Our all-inclusive rates include "extras" that aren't extra \$for you.

- Before and after-care
- No field trip/transportation fees
- Breakfast, morning, afternoon snack
- Sunscreen
- One lunch/week (see calendar)

Kamp Activities

Camper will have the opportunity to choose a variety of hands-on activity stations during each week. In addition, they will participate in field trips, small group activities, swimming, daily devotionals for kids and weekly reading incentives. Campers will also participate in arts & crafts, sports, science, nature, movies, and games. In addition, Campers are grouped together by appropriate grade level; second-fourth graders and fifth- sixth graders.

Activity Specifics

Swimming Pool Fieldtrips: We will need to know your child's swim level prior to any swimming field trip. They must bring their own towel and appropriate swimsuit.

Fieldtrips: We will be taking up to 3 field trips per week. Excellent behavior is expected on or off campus and the director will inform everyone of what your Kamper might need for each venture.

Creative Learning: Every day at Kamp Kaleidoscope, the children will get to explore our theme through a variety of hands-on activities to discover for themselves what interests them.

Weekly Reader Contests: This summer, we will be having a point system for children who read either at home or at Kamp. We will keep a running record for each camper to redeem for prizes at any time throughout the summer.

Daily Devos for Kids: Each morning, your camper will be involved in a short reflection time and daily devotional designed just for kids.

Movie Days: Kamp K may be watching movies at our facility or at a movie theater. On-site movies are typically shown after a swim day to give Kampers a chance to rest and relax after being out in the sun. All movies will be rated G. PG movies may be shown using a filter or at the discretion of the director.

Communication:

Daily: A white board will be located by the check-in area informing you of daily activities and fieldtrips.

Weekly: A weekly newsletter via email will be sent every Friday. This will provide information about the upcoming week's field trips and any news relevant to camp. It is imperative that the camp director has your current email address.

Monthly: A calendar will be provided that includes a tentative schedule. In the event of cancelled field trip, the camp director will determine what will be planned for the day.

Campers Needs List for Each Day:

- **Non-Refrigerated Sack Lunch**
We will provide drinks. We are unable to refrigerate or heat lunches. Ice packs or frozen water bottles aid in keeping things cold.
- **Water Bottle, Labeled with Camper's Name**
- **Tennis Shoes** (for playground and gym)
- **Optional:** Hats, glasses, etc.
- **Backpack**
- **Positive attitudes**

- **Medications:** Must be signed in at the Child Care office with a physician note and instructions.

Swimming days:

- **Bag to carry belongings**
- **Swimsuit, please wear to Kamp** (boy's suits must have lining no basketball shorts allowed)
- **Towel**
- **Sandals or flip-flops**
- **T-shirt**
- **Sunscreen**

What Not To Bring:

- **Heelys**
- **Hand Held Games/Gameboy's/DS etc...**
- **iPods, Cell Phones, iPads, etc. (All Electronics)**
- **Negative attitudes**



Sunscreen:

Kamp Kaleidoscope will provide a general SPF 30 or greater water resistant sunscreen or your child may bring their own from home. It is the children's responsibility to apply it as needed. Kamp staff will remind and assist the children if necessary. Sunscreen is applied 30 minutes before we go outside and once every hour while outside. Be sure to note sunscreen allergies on the medical form. Please label any sunscreen from home with your child's name.

Special Camp Lunches:

On occasion the campers will go out to eat. On these days, they will **not** need to bring a sack lunch. The cost of this lunch is included in the tuition. Dates will be noted on the monthly calendar and white board.

Our Staff:

Kamp Kaleidoscope teaching staff are well trained and have had years of experience working with children. Staff members have First Aid training and we always have a CPR certified staff member on site.

Clothing Guidelines:

Campers are expected to use discretion in their choice of appropriate attire at all times. The camp director reserves the right to determine what is suitable.

Discipline:

An important part of Kamp Kaleidoscope is to help your child develop appropriate and healthy friendships. Our goal is to create an environment where love, self-control and respect is given and received by all, including staff and our peers.

Policy for dealing with discipline problems

1. A warning, which is appropriate to the situation, to stop negative behavior will be given. To avoid embarrassment to the child, they will be separated from the group when behavior is being discussed.
2. Difficult discipline problems will be handled by the Kamp director and will be discussed with the parents in a timely manner.
3. If discipline problems continue a child may be excluded from a fieldtrip or in extreme cases a parent will be asked to pick up their child from Kamp K.
4. No Bullying, aggressive behavior, cursing, verbal put-downs, slang or racial comments will be tolerated!

Special Needs Forms:

In order for us to give your child the best care possible we need to know of any special medical, physical or emotional conditions. Please request and complete a special needs form from the Child Care office to make us aware of needs so we can plan the best care for your child. If your child has an IEP or 504 as part of their education plan at school, please provide a copy. All medicine (prescription or over the counter) will only be given with a written doctor's order. Please feel free to meet with the Kamp staff to discuss any special needs of your child. Due to safety concerns, some camp activities may not be appropriate for children with certain special needs. In such a case, alternate activities will be provided.

Check-In/Out procedures

For the safety of your child, we ask that each parent (or designated adult) come into the building and sign your camper in and out. There will be a sheet for such use outside of the main Kamp room. PLEASE DO NOT DROP OFF/PICK UP YOUR CHILD IN THE PARKING LOT! Our regular scheduled activities will be from 8-3, with **FREE** before and after care. In the event you are to pick up your child late (past 6:00pm on the child care clock), there will be a \$1.00/minute fee added to your account.
