While hiring requirements vary from country to country, the demand for English speaking teachers is incredibly high. This is due to over 1 billion people around the world taking classes to learn English every year.

Because of this high demand, it's easy to find employment all over the world.

You may be asking how you can get started with this amazing opportunity.

Below, I've listed the top 5 questions that are commonly asked by people who are most interested in this amazing opportunity.

Do I Need to Have a College Degree to Teach English Abroad?

It varies by country as to whether or not, having a college degree will affect your ability to teach English abroad.

A college degree is required in most western European nations, Asian countries and Persian Gulf countries.

However, there are always exceptions.

In many parts of the world, you will find that a college degree is not a determining factor. In fact, many Latin American countries, and Asian countries too, won't don't require a college degree.

Later, I'll show you how to access resources that'll better help you determine the requirements for various countries. Where I'm at now, Medellin, Colombia, a college degree was not required.

#2 What if I don't Have a Background as a Teacher?

Over 250,000 people work abroad teaching English, and many English speakers find opportunities abroad with little to no prior experience as a teacher.

Countries such as China, Turkey, Spain, and Latin American countries do not require any prior experience.

Approximately 100 countries around the globe hire native English speaker with no teaching background.

On the other hand, it is extremely difficult to gain employment in the UAE or Singapore without previous teaching experience ...

But as mentioned above, there are many places that won't require you to be a teacher

#3 What are the Age Requirements for Teaching **English Abroad?**

Age requirements vary around the globe, but for the most part, people of all ages can teach English abroad.

Individuals under 20 years old could find it difficult to secure a professional position, but will find many other opportunities in entry level positions or summer camps.

For older individuals looking to teach abroad, it will depend greatly on your resume. Some Asian countries and most Latin American countries have vast opportunities for the 50+ senior crowd.

#4 Can Non-Native English Speakers Teach English Abroad?

While requirements vary from country to country, it's absolutely possible to obtain a work visa to teach, even if English is not your native language.

Most major Asian nations, like South Korea, China, Japan, Vietnam and Thailand, strongly prefer native English speakers, while some countries even require citizenship from an English speaking country.

The same is true in Persian Gulf countries. In contrast, Latin America is a region where being from an English speaking country is not much of a factor in determining eligibility.

Other factors that may determine whether or not you can obtain a work visa as an English teacher is how fluent you speak English, and how thick your accent is, or whether or not you have a college degree or TEFL certification, and where you hold citizenship.

What do I need to get one of these teaching jobs abroad if I don't have a college degree?

You're going to need to get a TEFL certification. TEFL is the acronym for **Teaching English as a Foreign Language**.

It's also known as Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL), whereby you receive a certification to teach English to non-native English speakers.

While some countries do not require certification, many will require this certification when you don't hold a college degree, it's a huge asset to have TEFL certification on your resume ... This is your workaround to find these jobs if you don't have a degree.

The certification course incorporates at least 100 hours of coursework, in addition to 6-20 hours of live practice teaching. This training will teach you the skills you need to effectively provide a quality education.

The training will also provide you with job search guidance and assistance with the process of finding and applying for jobs in foreign countries.

Final Tips & Suggestions

It's completely possible to make your dream of living abroad a reality by teaching English. Research as much as you can and learn what opportunities await you based on your experience and qualifications.
