- <u>Prophecy</u>: The ability to receive and proclaim a message from God; one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouragement, consolation and warning.
- <u>Service</u>: The ability to identify and care for the physical needs of the body through a variety of means. The Greek word for this gift is the same as that for ministry or deacon.
- <u>Teaching</u>: The ability to clearly explain and effectively apply the truths of God's Word so that others will learn.
- Exhortation: The ability to motivate others to respond to the truth by providing timely words of counsel and encouragement.
- <u>Giving</u>: The ability to contribute material resources with generosity and cheerfulness for the benefit of others and the Glory of God.

- <u>Leadership</u>: The ability to discern God's purpose for a group, set and communicate appropriate goals, and motivate others to work together to fulfill them in the service of God.
- Mercy: The ability to deeply empathize and engage in compassionate acts on behalf of people who are suffering
  physical, mental or emotional distress.
- <u>Wisdom</u>: The ability to apply the principles of God's Word in a practical way to specific situations and recommend the best course of action at the best time.
- <u>Knowledge</u>: The ability to discover, analyze and systematize truth for the benefit of others.
- Faith: The ability to have a vision for what God wants to be done and to confidently believe that it will be accomplished in spite of circumstances and appearances to the contrary.
- Healing: The ability to serve as a human instrument through whom God supernaturally cures illnesses and restores health.
- Miracles: The ability to serve as an instrument through whom God accomplishes acts that manifest His supernatural
  power.
- <u>Distinguishing of spirits</u>: The ability to clearly discern the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.
- Tongues: The ability to receive and impart a spiritual message in a language the recipient never learned.
- <u>Interpretation of tongues</u>: The ability to translate into the vernacular a message publicly uttered in a tongue.
- Apostleship: This gift cease to exist since the requirement for the office of apostle includes having seen the physically resurrected Jesus.
- <u>Helps</u>: The ability to enhance the effectiveness of ministry of other members of the body.
- <u>Administration</u>: The ability to steer a church or Christian organization towards the fulfillment of its goals by managing it's affairs and implementing necessary plans.
- Evangelism: The ability to be unusually effective instrument in leading unbelievers to a saving knowledge of Christ.
- Shepherd or Pastor: The ability to personally lead, nourish, protect and care for the needs of a flock of believers.
- <u>Celibacy</u>: The ability to enjoy being single and maintain sexual self-control.
- Hospitality: The ability to welcome and provide for those in need of food and lodging.
