
Readings and liturgy will focus upon the love and hope of our faith through the proclaimed Word, carols, praise songs, and anthems of the season.





January 24-26: Mid-Winter Advance (MWA)

Always popular with our Youth Group, Mid-Winter Advance (MWA) is a weekend retreat at Refreshing Mountain in Stevens, Pennsylvania. Leaving Friday evening and returning Sunday afternoon, our youth will be treated to inspiring worship and impactful messages as they join over 200 students from New Jersey and Eastern Pennsylvania. Periods of downtime allow for volleyball and basketball tournaments, ziplining and a ropes course, visiting a reptile house, and time for fellowship. The

2025 theme is "Closer," based on the scripture from Isaiah 43:2. Cost will be \$125/attendee.

Appalachia Service Project (ASP) 2025

Appalachia Service Project is a mission organization serving areas in Virginia, West Virginia, Tennessee, and Kentucky to provide home repair ministry for families who desperately need that love and support. In August 2024, FMC sent a mission team of 25 youth and adults to Jonesville, Virginia, where we worked on three homes, repairing collapsing floors, building ramps, and replacing drywall. Our homeowners and volunteers were impacted in very powerful ways, so much so that we are ready to plan next summer's trip with ASP! - To make a machine-sewn flannel blanket, bring 4 yards of 42"-wide flannel, a sewing machine, thread, and scissors.


