

If there's one thing I hope you'll hear from me this season, it's this: you belong. God created you for love, belonging, and community. Whatever you're carrying—joy or sorrow, energy or weariness—you don't have to carry it alone.

Let's take a deep breath, say yes to connection, and walk together into this exciting new season!

Observing the widespread and severe effects of social

disconnection on Americans' health, many health experts believe that loneliness and isolation represent profound threats to our health and well-being. This reality reflects what our faith already teaches us: God created us for connection and community. Drawing on the experiences of the early church in Scripture, let us relearn how God leads us into lives of meaningful relationship with Godself and one another.



Staying connected to God helps us have more loving relationships with others and bear fruit.

September 14: Connection Among Christians Ephesians 4:1-6

Our local church is a place to build meaningful relationships through the gift of our one faith.

September 21: Connection with Community Hebrews 10:23-25

In our loneliness, we often retreat from church and community. We are called, as believers, to prioritize the time for worship and small groups, to encourage each other in the faith.



A New Path: October 12—26

Sometimes, following Jesus means letting go of what's behind so we can walk with purpose into what God is doing next. In this three-week series, we'll reflect on how God leads us forward—with courage, faith, and openness. Whether you're wrestling with change, seeking clarity, or just hoping for a fresh start, this series will remind us that God is not finished with us yet. Together, we'll explore how to take faithful steps into a future full of promise.

Division and barriers can isolate us from one another. Christ, through faith, can break down hostilities and move us into new community and connection with one another.




Appalachia Service Project Summer 2026
