DANGER OF RELIGION: RELIGION WILL KEEP YOU FROM GOD LOSING MY RELIGION SERIES

I. RELIGION AND OUR CULTURE: IS RELIGION GOOD OR BAD?

- A. WHAT IS CHRISTIANITY, WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A CHRISTIAN?
- B. PLACE OF RELIGION IN THE LAST 100 YEARS
 - 1. Early 1900's—Religion is good and necessary
 - 2. Mid 1900's—Religion is dying and destructive (Freud, Marx, Nietzsche)

- D. ARE THEY RIGHT? The only way to evaluate that is to learn from Jesus.

II. RELIGION AND JESUS: WAS JESUS RELIGIOUS?

I would submit that Jesus is the most anti-religious person to ever found a religion. Yes, our culture has gotten their critique of religion correct, by and large, but they are incorrect in that they believe they have destroyed Christianity in the process. Instead, they are Johnny-come-latelies because Jesus leveled the same deconstructing critique at religion (harsher actually) that they do. What they have done has not served to destroy Christianity but to make way for it. This is exactly what Jesus did—deconstruct the current conceptions of religion to clear the ground for the powerful message of the Gospel. He constantly goes through his ministry refusing to allow anyone to justify him/herself, especially in the Gospel of Luke. The word 'religion' is only used positively once in the entire Bible and that reference is ironic or tongue in cheek (James 1.27).

- A. LUKE 10 AND THE GOOD SAMARITAN—You cannot justify yourself. His religion is not just bad, but it will literally keep him from God.
- B. MATTHEW 21.31—The tax collectors and prostitutes go in before you.
- C. MATTHEW 23.23—"Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you tithe mint and dill and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faithfulness.
- D. MATTHEW 23.25—"For you clean the outside of the cup and the plate but on the inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence.
- E. Luke 15 and "The Prodigal Son"
 - 1. Two ways to find happiness: Self-discovery and Moral Conformity
 - Older brother represents the way of Moral Conformity
 - a. He did not leave home with the younger brother

- b. He did not embarrass the family
- c. He did not ruin the father's fortune
- d. He worked hard for the family (15.25)
- e. He obeyed every command (15.29)
- f. He always served the Father (15.29)
- g. Yet, he wants the father dead just like the younger bro

"The elder brother is not losing the father's love in spite of his goodness, but *because* of it. it is not his sins that create the barrier between him and his father, it's the pride he has in his moral record; it's not his wrongdoing but his righteousness that is keeping him from sharing in the feast of the father. There are two ways to be your own Savior and Lord. One is by breaking all the moral laws and setting your own course, and one is by keeping all the moral laws and being very, very good." (Tim Keller)

"The difference between him and his younger brother was that the younger brother was estranged and rebellious while absent from the house, but the older son was estranged and rebellious in his heart while he was in the house. The estrangement and rebellion of the younger son were evident in his surrender to his passions and in his request to leave his father's house. The estrangement and rebellion of the older son were evident in his anger and his refusal to enter the house." (Luqa Sa'id)

We clearly see the older brother in all the critiques of religion above—anger, superiority, externals, joylessness, desire to buy the father's favor, to control, etc. "There was a deep, black, wordless conviction in him that the way to avoid Jesus was to avoid sin." "What keeps us from Jesus is often not our sins but our damnable good works."

- 3. We all tend to look like one brother or the other. Though they look radically different, the roots are almost identical.
 - Both questioned their worth and identity (15.19, 29). The older brother almost needs the younger to be sinful. (Ex. Everybody Loves Ray)
 Yet the Father calls them both sons (15.24, 31)
 - b. Both have a wrong view of the Father as an overbearing taskmaster (15.12, 29). Yet he entreats, speaks tenderly, and humiliates Himself before both.

"People who are no longer sure that God loves and accepts them in Jesus, apart from their present spiritual achievements, are subconsciously radically insecure persons...Their insecurity shows itself in pride, a fierce, defensive assertion of their own righteousness, and defensive criticism of others. They come naturally to hate other cultural styles and other races in order to bolster their own security and discharge their suppressed anger." (Richard Lovelace)
