A. WHO NOT WHAT—THE PERSONALITY OF THE SPIRIT	
The Holy Spirit is not an entity, a thing, a force, an emotion, enthusiasm, courage, a personification of God (or good), or an 'it,' but a person—The Holy Spirit is a PERSON, the third member of the Triune Godhead. He is a person who can be followed (Romans 8.14, Galatians 5.16), received (Galatians 3.2), obeyed (Acts 21.11; Hebrews 3.7; I Timothy 4.1, Revelation 2.7, 11, 17), loved, (Colossians 1.8), lied to (Acts 5.3-4), rejoiced in (Luke 10.21), resisted (Acts 7.31), blasphemed (Matthew 12.31-32), and grieved (Isaiah 63.12, Ephesians 4.30). In addition, Scripture shows the Spirit speaking (Acts 13.2), having knowledge and wisdom (Isaiah 11.2, I Corinthians 2.10-11), having a mind (Romans 8.26-27), having a will (John 3.8, I Corinthians 12.11), having power (Romans 15.13), teaching (Luke 12.12), comforting (John 14.16, 26, 15.26), warning (I Timothy 4.1), and guiding (John 16.13).	
B. WHO NOW WHAT—THE SPIRIT'S ACTION IN THE LIFE OF A CHRISTIAN FROM ROMANS 8	
This is not just perip	led the personality of the Spirit, we need to see what He does, how He functions in our lives. There stuff, not just add-on, take it or leave it Christianity—it is crucial, live or die Christianity. Importance simply from Romans 8 ("The Great 8").
1.	The Spirit us from sin and death. In other words, he awakens us, regenerates us, and applies our salvation "in Christ (8.2)."
2.	The Spirit us to God (8.4-7). Can you imagine anything more central than the Spirit-given ability to please God?
3.	The Spirit gives us as opposed to condemnation and as opposed to death (8.6, 11)
4.	The Spirit that we are Christians, that we are "in Christ (8.9)." Every Christian has the Spirit and belongs to Christ by the Spirit.
5.	The Spirit us (8.11). He works internally like leaven, permeating every aspect of our being and producing his fruit (Gal. 5.22-24).
6.	The Spirit sin (Romans 8.13). We cannot battle any sin in our lives without the removal of condemnation and the power of the Spirit to put it to death.
7.	The Spirit us (8.14). We can only follow God if we are led by the Spirit. It is this leading that proves we are "children of God (8.15-17).
8.	The Spirit us into the family of God (8.15). He is even called here the "Spirit of adoption." It is only by the Spirit that we become sons of the Father. He officiates, as it were, the wedding between us and the Son which brings us into fellowship, communion, and family life of the Triune God.
9.	The Spirit that we are in fact children of God (8.15-17).
10.	The Spirit for us (8.26-27). He knows the mind of God and He knows our minds and hearts through and through. He uses that knowledge to intercede for us before the throne of God, even when we are weak and don't know how to pray.
