2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly Guidebook — Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the ELCA Churchwide Assembly Guidebook?

It's a mobile app (for tablets) commissioned by the churchwide office to replace much of the paper resources of the 2019 churchwide assembly, and to be an information source for assembly participants.

2. What are the minimum requirements for using the ELCA Guidebook?

While the ELCA Guidebook will work across multiple devices (and even in a [standard web browser](#)), it is optimized for use on an iPad. The minimum requirement for Apple devices is iOS version 11.0 or later, Lightning power connector, and greater-than 9-inch screen. The minimum requirements for Android devices are Android OS version 5.0 and greater than 9-inch screen size.

3. What is the Pre-Assembly Report?

A section within the ELCA Guidebook that is a replacement for the large bulky paper binder distributed in the past to assembly voting members. The e-binder has sections and sub-sections for organizing document files. Most documents are "PDF" files that you can open to read, annotate and search.

4. How do I access/install the Guidebook?

There are basically three ways to access the Guidebook (also highlighted in this web page: <https://guidebook.com/g/2019cwa/>):

- As an "App" you install on your iPad or iPhone. For Apple devices go to the Apple App Store and search for ELCA Organizations and Events. After installing that app, download the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly guide.
- As an "App" you install on your Android phone or tablet. For Android devices, go to the Google Play Store and search for ELCA Organizations and Events. After installing that app, download the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly guide.

You shouldn't be prompted for a Passphrase, but if you are, use: 2019cwa

5. Why should I create a Guidebook account?

A free Guidebook account allows you to log in to the iOS or Android version of the app and to the web version of the guide and have features like My Schedule stay in sync. In the apps you are also able to find and message other attendees.

6. How will the ELCA Guidebook content be updated?

When changes to the ELCA Guidebook are published, it can take up to 10 minutes for the new content to appear on your device. To be sure your Guidebook is up to date, tap the refresh icon at the top of your screen.  When assembly staff update the guide, it is usually available for download within 30 seconds of the update.

7. How will I know I have the latest version of a document being considered by the Assembly?

Any document files that have been revised will have revision numbers in the file name and description.

8. What's the best way to navigate forms linked to from the Guidebook app?

Some submission forms and surveys in the Churchwide Assembly Guidebook open in a web browser in order to complete and submit the form. When navigating through forms, avoid using navigation buttons provided by Guidebook or a web browser; instead use the Next button on each of page of each form. Using other navigation buttons can cause form submission errors.

9. How do I annotate documents in the ELCA Guidebook?

iAnnotate is special markup software that is built into the iPad version of the ELCA Guidebook app. Using the ELCA Guidebook, you can set personal bookmarks in a document, mark sections of interest to you with a color highlight, draw on a document with your finger, underline portions of a document, and copy a highlighted section of text to the clipboard to paste into another application (e.g. an email). Non-iPad users can annotate locally-saved documents using Adobe Reader or other software.

10. If I annotate a PDF using the annotation features of the ELCA Guidebook, will the notes carry over to the new version of that PDF?

No, because document updates often change the structure of a document, it is not possible to carry over your annotations. However, you will retain the notes on the version of the document you have entered notes on.

11. How can I keep notes for myself or for submissions?

As mentioned above, you can use the PDF annotation features in the iPad guide or in Adobe Reader on an Android tablet. You can also use the "Notes" app on the "home" screen of the iPad or an app like Google Keep on Android to create and edit text, or paste and modify text from documents. When you copy text from a PDF you will probably get hard breaks at the end of lines that you may need to remove.

12. How do I keep a copy of my documents and notes after the assembly is over?

Each PDF document in the ELCA Guidebook may be emailed using the email icon in the bottom right corner of the screen:

13. What will happen to the data on the iPad after the assembly?

All data on the iPad will be removed shortly after the end of the assembly, so be sure to email yourself anything you wish to retain.
