#### **Application Procedures**

Send cover letter describing your interest in the internship, identifying the area in which you would like to work, as well as a curriculum vitae, and at least one recommendation from a Harvard University faculty member to the supervising curator listed above. Your cover letter should indicate what will be your student status in the fall of 2018. Applications will be accepted until **Monday**, **April 23, 2018**.
