

## PRIOR TO DROPPING YOUR KIDS OFF AT REDEEMER:

Please review the list below. If any of these apply to your child, we lovingly ask that they stay home until they have resolved.

- Been diagnosed with COVID-19 or had close contact\* in the last 14 days with someone diagnosed with COVID-19
- Awaiting the result of a COVID-19 test for anyone in your home
- Fever or chills in the past 72 hours
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New cough
- New loss of taste or smell

\*Close contact with someone is defined as being within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes or living in the same home.



## COVID Communication Policy Redeemer Kids + Students Adopted 08.2020

We want to communicate appropriately and promptly with any who might be affected by a positive COVID test in our ministries while following all government guidelines for patient privacy.

See below for our process of communication in the case of a positive COVID test by a student or child who has attended a ministry environment. Please note that we do not have the ability to provide full contact tracing but will act in accordance with all best practices and current policies.

## If there is a positive test in Redeemer Students:

- 1. We will identify and inform all parents of students who were in a small group environment with that student within 24 hours of our awareness of a positive test.
- 2. After those parents have been informed, we will communicate by email to the parents of all students present at the event that a student has tested positive for COVID while identifying only the grade.

## If there is a positive test in Redeemer Kids:

- 1. We will identify and inform all parents of kids who were in the classroom during the same service hour within 24 hours of our awareness of a positive test
- 2. After those parents have been informed, we will communicate by email to the parents of all children present on that weekend that a child has tested positive for COVID while identifying only the grade and service hour.

\*At no point can any further identifying information be shared about the student or child who has tested positive. The sharing of personal, private, medical information would be in violation of HIPAA privacy rules.

\*\*Enhanced sanitization and cleaning procedures have been adopted by all ministry environments between events and services.
