#### WHAT IT TAKES TO REBUILD

# 1. Make sure God's hand is on you.

With a prayer to the God of heaven, I replied, "If you are pleased with me, your servant, send me to Jerusalem so I can rebuild it." And because the gracious hand of my God was on me, the king granted my requests. Nehemiah 2:4–5, 8

# 2. Make sure to <u>define reality</u>.

I went to Jerusalem, and after staying there three days I set out during the night with a few others. I had not told anyone what my God had put in my heart to do for Jerusalem. By night I went out through the Valley Gate toward the Jackal Well, examining the walls of Jerusalem, which had been broken down, and destroyed by fire. Nehemiah 2:11–14

When you live by faith it doesn't mean you ignore reality.

You will never have <u>all the facts</u> when you live by your own <u>experience</u> and <u>assumptions</u>

## 3. Expect opposition.

But when Sanballat the Horonite, Tobiah the Ammonite and Geshem the Arab heard about it, they mocked and ridiculed us. "What is this you are doing?" they asked. "Are you rebelling against the king?" Nehemiah 2:19

## 4. Use the power of a team.

Eliashib the high priest and the other priests started to rebuild at the Sheep Gate. Uzziel, one of the goldsmiths, repaired the next section; and Hananiah, one of the perfume-makers, made repairs next to that. Shallum, a district governor of Jerusalem, repaired the next section with the help of his daughters. Each one repaired the section immediately across from his own house. Nehemiah 3:1,8,12,28

So the wall was completed in fifty-two days. Nehemiah 6:15
