what to expect

LITURGY

A liturgical service might be unfamiliar for you, and that's okay. We've tucked notes about the service in the margins for you.

MUSIC

Making music together is a gift we give to each other and a collective offering to God in worship. Songs vary in style and source to reflect the many places we all come from.

COMMUNITY

None of us has it together, and we don't expect that of you, either. We firmly believe that every one of us is in need of the saving work of Jesus Christ.

KIDS

During the service, kids can enjoy fun, safe programming run by background-checked volunteers and staff. Or, if you'd prefer to keep your children with you, they're always welcome in the service—noises and all!

- **NURSERY:** ages 0-4: Check kids in at any time during the service, and pick them up when the sermon ends. Turn right out of the worship hall to get to the nursery.
- CHILDREN'S CHURCH: preschoolers aged 2.5-4 & early elementary schoolers aged 5-2nd grade: Classes gather at the kids table in the side hallway during the break, and they return to the worship hall after the sermon.
- IN THE SERVICE: Babies and kids of all ages are always welcome in the service. Drawing supplies are available at the kids table in the cafe.

PRAYERS OF ADORATION

Having sung our praises to God, we lift our voices individually in adoration. We use this time to express more deeply our worship and adoration of God.

confession & assurance

be seated

In confession, we take a few moments to evaluate ways our lives speak in contradiction to God's holy word. We do this through considering a passage of scripture, and then silently reflecting on a few questions the passage raises about our lives.

Our corporate prayer of confession enables us as one congregation to confess our sins and then to hear the unequivocal pardon of God's grace in the assurance of pardon.

CONFESSION OF SIN: Exodus 17:1-7

All the congregation of the people of Israel moved on from the wilderness of Sin by stages, according to the commandment of the LORD, and camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. Therefore the people guarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink." And Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the LORD?" But the people thirsted there for water, and the people grumbled against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our livestock with thirst?" So Moses cried to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me." And the LORD said to Moses, "Pass on before the people, taking with you some of the elders of Israel, and take in your hand the staff with which you struck the Nile, and go. Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock at Horeb, and you shall strike the rock, and water shall come out of it, and the people will drink." And Moses did so, in the sight of the elders of Israel. And he called the name of the place Massah and Meribah, because of the quarreling of the people of Israel, and because they tested the LORD by saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

- 1. Have I given up hope of ever seeing change?
- 2. Have I stopped praying, or taken matters into my own hands?
- 3. How do my actions or attitude reflect my response to the question posed "Is the LORD among us or not?"

CORPORATE PRAYER OF CONFESSION

sermon

Genesis II:27-I2:9

^{11:27} Now these are the generations of Terah. Terah fathered Abram, Nahor, and Haran; and Haran fathered Lot. 28 Haran died in the presence of his father Terah in the land of his kindred, in Ur of the Chaldeans. 29 And Abram and Nahor took wives. The name of Abram's wife was Sarai, and the name of Nahor's wife, Milcah, the daughter of Haran the father of Milcah and Iscah. 30 Now Sarai was barren; she had no child.

31 Terah took Abram his son and Lot the son of Haran, his grandson, and Sarai his daughter-inlaw, his son Abram's wife, and they went forth together from Ur of the Chaldeans to go into the land of Canaan, but when they came to Haran, they settled there. 32 The days of Terah were 205 years, and Terah died in Haran.

^{12:1} Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. 2 And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."

⁴ So Abram went, as the Lord had told him, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventyfive years old when he departed from Haran. ⁵ And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their possessions that they had gathered, and the people that they had acquired in Haran, and they set out to go to the land of Canaan. When they came to the land of Canaan, ⁶ Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. ⁷ Then the Lord appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him. 8 From there he moved to the hill country on the east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east. In Communion (also called the Eucharist, which literally means "thanksgiving"), we are invited to partake of elements of bread and wine to drink deeply of the grace of Jesus Christ. We reflect on how thankful we are for the work of Christ on our behalf, and we pray that his grace would work more powerfully in our lives to change us more into his likeness.

BREAKING OF THE BREAD

LEADER: Therefore, let us proclaim the mystery of the faith:

PEOPLE: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again!

DISTRIBUTION OF THE CUP

- Come forward by rows to receive communion elements.
- Grape juice is in the individual cups, and wine is available from the common cup. Gluten-free communion elements are available on the table.
- A pastor is available up front to pray with you for your noncommuning child.
- You can also take this time to pray. Some sample prayers are provided on the opposite page.

GUIDELINES FOR RECEPTION OF COMMUNION:

The Lord's Supper is the family meal of Christians. We invite all committed followers of Jesus Christ to partake of this sacrament: those who are baptized members under the care and oversight of a congregation which proclaims the gospel, who are at peace with God and with their neighbor, and who seek strength to live more faithfully for Christ. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer using the prayers that follow as guidelines. We hope that this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with his people, the church.

SILENT PRAYERS FOR THOSE NOT COMMUNING

Prayer for those searching for truth

God, I am pressed and discontent. I am drawn to certain aspects of Christianity, which is why I am here. If you are really there, then who are you, Lord? If you are Jesus Christ, who claimed to be the way, the truth, and the life, please guide me into this reality. Are you calling me? Grant that I might be undaunted by the cost of following you as I consider the reasons for doing so. Give me an understanding of you that is coherent, convincing, and that leads to the life that you promise. Amen.

Prayer of belief

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever before believed, but through You, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. You paid my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that you have been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and trust you as Savior and Lord, Amen.

Prayer of commitment for those not yet baptized

Lord Jesus, you have called us to follow you in baptism and in a life of committed discipleship in your church. I resolve before You to take the necessary steps to be one with your people, and live in the fullness of your Spirit. Amen.

Prayer for those refusing to reconcile with another

Lord Jesus, I do not want to forgive and be forgiven. My situation of offense seems to me an insurmountable obstacle. Grant that I may discern the body of Christ in my sisters and brothers. Melt my icy heart with the cross, because I cannot forgive without knowing anew how much I have been forgiven. Help my unbelief that I may find my reputation, respect, security and welfare in you. May mercy triumph over judgment in my life. Amen


