- **3.** The next name drawn will then have the option of taking from the tree the unwrapped gift, opening a wrapped gift or taking a gift that another member unwrapped. Once a gift has been taken one time that gift cannot be taken again.
- 4. This will continue for the remainder of the names.

Shark Bites from MOTM 2010

I went to the business meeting during MOTM 2010. I was actually sober – it was in the morning. These are "shark bites" from the notes I took:

- In 2009 we raised \$2.8 million.
- Over 18 years we have raised \$19.2 million.
- There were 53 applicants for the scholarship fund. Second place \$3,000 and first place \$5,000. First place was to a Parrot Head who had to drop out a couple of years ago because of the death of his son, and is going back to school.
- Out of your dues \$1 goes to PHiP for scholarships, member discounts at Avis, etc., MOTM, with more coming i.e. Costco discounts.
- Wesley House, one of MOTM's charities, handles all of the keys in Monroe County. They take care
 of kids 0-23 years of age who have been abused or neglected. Wesley House also has foster families.
 They handled 350 cases last year, providing 23 new homes through adoption. They provide preschool
 and after school programs and also work with teen parents.
- Regarding the Blood Drive, since 2000 MOTM has served 2619 patients, including 66 units donated last year serving 190 patients. This year they surpassed that by Parrot Heads donating 91 units as of Saturday, November 6 and still counting!
- The Salvation Army provided 418 backpacks for school and toys for 300 families in Key West, thanks to PHiP.
- From the Bloody Mary party this year, \$1,000 was raised.
- The new Board for PHiP has not changed this year.
- Raffle charities will be decided in the spring for next year.
- Over 12 years, Margaritaville has given the Cancer Foundation of the Florida Keys \$200 million.
- The Golden Coconut Award for 2010 went to the Galveston Bay Parrot Head Club. Peggy Wright accepted the award. Congratulations!


