

Wabash Sampling Blitz:

- Put on by the Wabash River Enhancement Corporation (WREC) – started in 2009
- Happens every fall and spring
- Volunteers are assigned to different locations and tasked with taking a sample of the Wabash.
- Data is used to identify where poor water quality is located

WREC:

- Non-profit Organization
- Goals: to improve the riverfront, the river corridor, and water quality
- Raised over \$1 million for the completion of long range plans for the entire 31 miles of river corridor in Tippecanoe County.
- Plans call for trail improvements, additional bicycle and pedestrian bridges, and green spaces to connect communities to each other and to the river.
- Works closely with community partnerships
 - Riverfest- event to celebrate the river and all that local groups are doing to improve water quality
 - TippEcoNow- online portal to all things green- is a campaign to increase awareness about urban impacts to the Wabash River's water quality and habitat within Greater Lafayette.
 - This site is to raise awareness about the Wabash and gives people suggestions as to
 - Paint the Rain- arts program to highlight the beauty of rain barrels and the talents of local artists.

Upper Wabash River Basin Commission:

- Strives to improve the Wabash River watersheds in Adams, Huntington, Wells and Jay Counties, Indiana.
- Has organized river clean up events (ask volunteers to pick up trash/litter around the river as well as in the river on canoes)
