Questions About the Text

1) Tyler said Genesis reveals a redemptive way forward. How does Paul's description of the gospel as "promised beforehand" reinforce that God's plan started long before Jesus' birth? (Romans 1:2)

2) Why is it important, in the context of Genesis, to see Jesus as both fully human (*descended from David*) and fully divine (*declared Son of God in power*)? (Romans 1:3–4)

3) Tyler mentioned creation continually reveals who God is. How do verses 19–20 support the idea that “Genesis 1-3 still speaks” into a spiritually hungry world? (Romans 1:19–20)

4) Paul says people are “without excuse” because of what creation reveals. How should this shape how we view Genesis not just as ancient text, but as an ongoing testimony? (Romans 1:20)

5) Tyler talked about exchanging the glory of the Creator for cheap substitutes. Where in your life do you sense a temptation to settle for something less than God’s original design? (Romans 1:23)

Questions About the Sermon

1) During the message we were asked, “Why do you have to know it all before you obey what you already know?” How does that challenge your spiritual life?

2) Tyler said that we live in a season of spiritual hunger. Where do you see that hunger—and how are you responding to it?

3) The message framed Genesis as helping us discern between the temporary pleasures of lies and the eternal person of truth. What does that tension look like in your current season?

4) Tyler talked about stewarding your life according to your design and purpose. What’s one area where you need to return to God’s design?

5) Tyler referenced Romans 1:18–25 to show how creation reveals God. How might this help you engage others in spiritual conversations?

Questions from the Book

1) What is our purpose in this life, and how does our purpose point to our destiny?

2) Why is the world the way that it is, and how did it get to be this way?
