Questions About the Text

1) What does the shift in language from "God" to "LORD God" suggest about God's relationship with humanity in this passage? (Genesis 2:4, 7)

2) Why do you think God formed man from the dust and breathed into him rather than speaking him into existence like the rest of creation? (Genesis 2:7)

3) What role do the rivers and resources in Eden play in the picture of God's provision and intentional design? (Genesis 2:10–14)

4) How do the commands to “work” and “keep” the garden connect to worship and obedience in your daily life? (Genesis 2:15)

5) What does the presence of both the Tree of Life and the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil teach us about freedom, choice, and trust? (Genesis 2:9, 17)

Questions About the Sermon

1) Tyler said, “Some of us want an Eden experience without an Eden relationship.” What does an “Eden relationship” look like in your life right now?

2) How does deeper intimacy with God require stronger or more intentional boundaries? Can you give a personal example?

3) The sermon emphasized that boundaries don't restrict life but allow us to flourish. Where have you seen that truth play out in your own spiritual journey?

4) How does the image of being “put” in the garden for rest, worship, and obedience challenge or encourage your view of your current calling? (Genesis 2:15)

5) What's one boundary in your life that you now see as a gift from God rather than a limitation?

2) Make a list of everything you learned about Man's character and nature from this scripture reading. Discuss.
