



5 Key Behaviors of a Disciple
Grow and mature into a high impact Christ follower
with a biblical world view!

1. Develop a Personal Relationship with Jesus Christ

Seek to know Him as a living friend not just a historical figure. The relationship is personal, not institutional, and is motivated by how you can give glory to God in all aspects of your life. With disciplined practice you will come to know Jesus as both Lord and Savior. *John 15:7-9*

2. Commit to a Small Group with Loving Accountability

Jesus knew that becoming an intentional Christian could not be accomplished in isolation. His twelve disciples comprised the first small group. As you seek to live more like Jesus every day, give others permission to support you and speak into your life. *Colossians 1:28, Galatians 6:1-2*

3. Serve Others Through Acts of Love

Jesus came to serve. Be compelled to follow His example and reflect a life in Christ to build God's Kingdom. Seek to glorify God through use of your spiritual gifting and your talents. Answer the call to act for those in need. *Mark 10:45, 1 Peter 4:10-11*

4. Give Generously through a Life of Stewardship

Acknowledge that God created the universe and owns it all. Take on the stewardship of His gifts to you of time, talent, resources, relationships and truth. God gives you the time to everything He has planned for you to do; the talent to service the church, the resources to support ministries, grace to nurture relationships and the privilege to share truth. *Matthew 25:14-29*

5. Share the Gospel and Disciple Others

Model a Christ-centered life and nurture other followers; this is your fundamental calling from Christ. Share your own personal faith journey to bring others to Him. Live your life to reflect His Lordship with authenticity and transparency. Invest your life in the lives of others to help engage, equip, and encourage the making of other Christ followers – disciples of Christ. *Matthew 28:19-20*
