- 2. Update on Sale of Joe DiMaggio Right of Way Alan Dunn reported that an agreement with Brinegar Properties has been signed to negotiate a possible sale of the right of way; he discussed pricing with the realtor; Alan reported that the property adjacent to the church property is to be a 350 apartment complex.
- 3. Affirm Electronic Meeting Alan Dunn discussed affirming the action taken during the called electronic council meeting requesting approval to enter into an agreement with Brinegar Properties to negotiate a sale price of the Joe DiMaggio Right of Way.
 - MOTION: Paula Dietz moved to affirm the action taken at the called electronic meeting. Motion carried.
- 4. Combined Worship the council scheduled a combined worship service for Sunday, January 30, 2022, at 9:00 am; the Annual Congregational Meeting will follow the worship service; the council was reminded that their help will be needed before and after worship; we will attempt to make the meeting a hybrid meeting (in-person and on-line via ZOOM).

PASTOR KOPPEL'S REPORT

How I invest my time:

Studying and reading the Bible, Devotions, Prayers for our members and community: staying grounded in the Word of God and in touch with the needs of our congregation and community.

Worship Preparation and leadership: writing sermons, prayers, bulletin outlines, and A/V sermon outlines for the *Rejoice!* service, and discussion questions; writing full scripts for the online worship services, choosing music for traditional services, working on special services, (such as Ash Wednesday, and Wednesdays in Lent, combined services, etc.), funerals –including family counseling, proofing bulletins, wedding planning, baptism planning, and planning out themes and hymns several weeks in advance.

Teaching: planning and teaching confirmation class, Adult Bible Study every Monday, Hispanic Leadership classes, First Communion classes.

Writing: weekly emails to the congregation, sermons, articles, letters of recommendation for our members. Monthly reports, research for a possible preaching and small group series

Administration and training: Meet with entire staff weekly, meet weekly with intern pastor daily and seminarian usually twice per week. Coaching with Director of Children's Ministries and Director of Youth Ministries.

Coaching/Counseling: Meet with several individuals and families around issues of death, marital and family issues, pre-marital, pre-surgery, cancer, unemployment issues, and more.

Youth and children: Stop in at the Wednesday night youth group, attend JAM. Organize and teach confirmation classes

Visitation: Home and Hospital visits as needed in conjunction with intern pastor and Stephen Ministers. We typically have several members hospitalized, others with health/family concerns, occasional visits to those who are incarcerated.

Major congregational events: congregational meetings, forums, celebrations (Confirmation Sunday, Rally Day, Wednesday Evening Lenten Series, Congregation Small Group Sermon Series.

Special service planning: funerals/memorial services, weddings, baptisms, etc.: This can take a significant amount of time. [We had 4 funerals this past month.]

Other meetings/learning/coaching: Ironmen, Worship and Music Committee, Finance Committee, Personnel committee, Executive Committee, Endowment Committee, Council, and other committees as available.

Contacts with potential new members: (letters, phone calls, personal notes) and with members who have been absent

Larger church and Community: Round Rock Ministerial Association meetings, quarterly Round Rock Pastors meeting, encouraging and coaching younger pastors (currently mentoring two), helping coordinate Mayor's Prayer Breakfast, National Day of Prayer at the Baptist Children's Home, working with Water for Africa, and Sacred Heart Community Clinic. Attend Undoing Racism Round Rock meetings. Volunteer as Round Rock Police Chaplain.

Continuing Education: Police Chaplain training. Attended National Pastor's Conference, SWT-ELCA Synod Assembly, SWT Bishop's convocation. Will be attending ELCA Larger Church Conference in May 2022.

Other ways of representing Palm Valley throughout the year:

Attending swearing in of City Council members, Police Officers, Meeting with potential counselors before making referrals for our members Attending our youth's school plays and sporting events when available Long term planning work
