



Saffronart's 25th Anniversary Evening Sale sets a world record for the highest value sale of South Asian art at an auction globally in history.

- Saffronart's 25th Anniversary live evening sale, concluded on 27 September in New Delhi, achieving a cumulative sales value of INR INR 355.77 crores (USD 40.20 million).
- V S Gaitonde, *Untitled* lot, 1970 sold for INR 67.08 crores (USD 7.57 million), achieving a world record for the highest price achieved by the artist at auction globally.
 - F N Souza, Six Gentlemen of Our Times, 1955 (set of six) was sold for INR 20.40 crores (USD 2.30 million), achieving the highest value for a work on paper by a South Asian artist in an auction globally.

Delhi, 27 September 2025: Saffronart's 25th Anniversary live evening sale held on 27 September 2025 in New Delhi was another white glove sale with enthusiastic bidding and sales. The live auction featured an impressive catalogue of 85 lots with 100% of the lots being sold and achieving a cumulative sales value of INR 355.77 crores (USD 40.20 million). The sale breaks Saffronart's previous world record set in April 2025 with their 25th Anniversary Live and Online Sale. *Untitled* lot, 1970 (lot 23) by V S Gaitonde sold for INR 67.08 crores (USD 7.57 million), nearly 3 times its higher estimate, filling the auction room with overwhelming applause and jubilation.

This year, five rare lots by Indian modernists, formerly from the **Krishna and Jean Riboud collection**, were part of the live sale. Another highlight was **F N Souza**'s seminal series of six portraits, *Six Gentlemen of Our Times*, 1955 (lot 13) which was sold for **INR 20.40 crores (USD 2.30 million)**, achieving the highest value for a work on paper by a South Asian artist in an auction globally.

RECORD SALES ACHIEVED:

- World record An Untitled lot by V S Gaitonde, 1970 (lot 23) (was sold for INR 67.08 crores (USD 7.57 million), nearly 3 times its higher estimate, achieving a world record for the highest price achieved by the artist at auction globally and 2nd highest value work of Indian art sold worldwide.
- Artist records -

Trussed Bull by Tyeb Mehta, 1956 (lot 16) sold for INR 56.40 crores (USD 6.37 million), 8 times its higher estimate.

The Anchorite by Jehangir Sabavala, 1983 (lot 48) was sold for INR 16.80 crores (USD 1.89 million), surpassing its higher estimate, achieving 2nd highest value work by Jehangir Sabavala





sold at auction globally.

F N Souza's Six Gentlemen of Our Times, 1955 (lot 13) was sold for INR 20.40 crores (USD 2.30 million), achieving the highest value for a work on a paper by a South Asian artist in an auction globally.

 Other artist records-Nursery Tales by Nalini Malani, 2008 (lot 82) was sold for INR 3.60 crores (USD 406,780), over five times its higher estimate. Highest price achieved by Nalini Malani in an auction globally, breaking the previous record also set by Saffronart.

Barken am Zattere by Walter Langhammer, (lot 7) was sold for INR 38.40 lakhs (USD 43,390) more than double its lower estimate.

Self-Portrait by Jyoti Bhatt, 1956 (lot 32) was sold for INR 50.40 lakhs (USD 56,949).

An *Untitled* lot by Sohan Qadri, 2010 (lot 81) was sold for INR 72 lakhs (USD 81,356), surpassing its higher estimate. The 2nd highest value work by Sohan Qadri sold at auction globally.

Minal Vazirani, Saffronart President and Co-Founder, said, "Our 25th Anniversary Evening Sale set a historic milestone, achieving the highest value sale of South Asian art at an auction globally in history. The sale surpassed the record we set in April 2025 by over 60%. Featuring masterpieces by pre-modern and modern artists, this landmark sale establishes a new benchmark for the Indian art market going forward.
