

In care for those desiring communion at our altar for the first time, we ask that you speak with Pastor prior to Communion.

- Holy Communion is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself.
- Our Lord has instructed us to examine ourselves before participating in this meal (1 Corinthians 11:23-32).
- In preparation for the sacrament, you should ask yourself the following questions:
 - Am I a sinner, and am I sorry for my sins?
 - Do I believe that Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior?
 - Do I believe that Christ gives me His body and blood together with the bread and wine for the forgiveness of my sins?
 - Will I try, with God's help, to amend my sinful life?

Lenten Series: One of the Bible's greatest wisdom books is the



book of Job. This Lent we will explore this magnificent composition that is numbered among the greatest literature of all time. The overarching theme of Job is suffering. We all suffer—personally and privately. We also suffer in more public ways. A

husband loses a job. A child gets divorced. A parent dies. And now, thanks to the media, we are able to see and experience more and more of the world's catastrophes and suffering. Why do we suffer? How can and should a Christian handle suffering? The Lenten sermons will help us to learn how to apply the book of Job to our lives so that the book becomes less like a long, impenetrable series of orations and misconceptions about Job's suffering, and more like a loving companion through our own darkest valleys. We need the book of Job, now, more than ever.
