Families are valued here! Thank you for trusting us with your time and spiritual care. Kids activity sheets and crayons are available on tables as you enter worship.

Two family-friendly rooms are located to the left and right of the main level sanctuary. One room is exclusively for nursing moms while the other is available for families who might need a quieter environment or simply more space to move during worship.

## HOLY COMMUNION

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper as instituted by Jesus the night before He died. In keeping with 1 Corinthians 11:26-29, we ask everyone seeking communion to examine themselves by asking:

Am I sorry for my sins and desire forgiveness?

Do I believe that Jesus, by His death, offers me forgiveness?

Do I believe that I receive the true body and blood of Christ with the bread and wine?

Do I desire, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to turn from my sinful ways?

All who trust in these words of Christ, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," who share our confession of faith, and can answer "Yes!" to the questions above, are invited to join us in this celebration!

If you choose not to commune with us, we invite you and any children who have not yet received communion instruction to come forward to receive a blessing. To communicate that you want a blessing instead of communion, simply cross your arms when you come forward. For those who prefer, we offer grape juice and gluten-free wafers. Grape juice is in the center of the communion trays, and you can ask for a gluten-free wafer when you come forward.

Our worship assistants and ushers are available to bring communion to those unable to come to the rail. To indicate that you need this service, please speak to one of our team members with the blue-colored lanyards before communion, and they will make sure to bring it to you.

## Confession & Absolution

- P** God's Word in 1 Timothy 3 says, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." And still, before a holy God, we confess that we neglect this gift, ignoring His Word even though it alone equips us for every good work. So this morning let us confess the lack of our good works to our Heavenly Father.

*Time for silence and self reflection.*

- C** Gracious God, we confess that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed by what we have done and what we have left undone. We have not lived as Your redeemed people, and we have failed to carry out our good works done in love.
- P** Gracious God, You have breathed out Your Word to teach us and make us wise for salvation.
- C** Yet we confess that we often neglect the Scriptures You have given us. We know Your Word gives life, but we don't run towards it. We know Your Word is true, but we do not remain in it. We listen to many voices but are slow to listen to Yours. Forgive us for treating Your Word as optional. Forgive us for treating the good of our neighbor as optional. Forgive us for treating You like You're optional. Amen.
- P** In the Garden of Eden, God breathed His life giving breath into the nostrils of Adam and called all of His creation good. That same breath is breathed into scripture and He calls it good. That good and living Word now speaks a better word over you. Through the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, God breathes forgiveness, life, and salvation into sinners. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

## GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP COLLECTION

---

On Venture youth group's annual mission trip to Guatemala over Spring Break, Megumi Going will add her passion to the ministry this year: dentistry. To accomplish this, she will be speaking around town and in St. Peter's school classrooms, Sunday School classes, Connect Groups, and Bible studies about poverty in Guatemala and its impact on dental health. **She is asking Columbus families to donate toothbrushes, toothpaste, and floss, which she will then take on the mission trip to Santiago Zamora. All donations need to be received by Sunday, March 8.** The youth group typically prepares an exciting Vacation Bible School program for the children of the village, and this year it has been arranged for Megumi to go to local schools (even a public one!) to teach about dental hygiene (something she does here in Columbus with the C4 program at East). Please pray that many donations of dental supplies will be collected and that Megumi will teach the Guatemalan children dental health along with the importance of their health in God's eyes as His beloved creations. She chose Psalm 139:14 as her theme verse because *"although I am interested in serving physically, helping bodies to be healthy, I wanted to point out how wonderful our bodies are. I wanted to tie into the Gospel, not just a verse about the body, and this verse talks about God's works, so can connect to His work of salvation, too."*

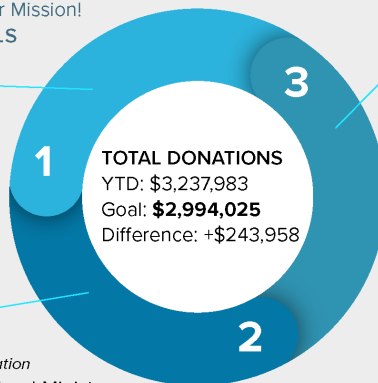
